I got two brand new pairs of boots





\$215,000 Bond Election **Absentee Ends Friday**


Absentee balloting in the Tuesday, Oct. 31, \$215,000 tax bond election, ends Friday at

> the Commission at the urging of a group asking that bonds be sold to build the \$215,000 library center. Total cost including interest and fees will exceed \$340,000. If approved, the indebtedness would be retired over a 16 year period through the increase of tax valuations by 30 percent. The City presently charges \$2.50 rate (maximum) but has a low 25 percent tax valuation. This 25 percent would be increased by 30 percent to raise the necessary additional funds for the bond. This hike would amount to approximately \$20 property valuation

56 MILLION HARVEST 80% IN

A peanut crop valued at over \$6 million is being harvested in Eastland County. County Agent DeMarquis Gordon said the harvest is about 80 percent completed. This will likely be the largest peanut crop ever harvested in the county he said.

The previous high year was 1968 when the average yield was 1474 pounds per acre. David Martin, ASCS Director, says early reports indicate that yields will be above the 1968 average yield.

The Gorman peanut company reports that yields are 15 to 20 percent better than last year. The average yield last year was 1002 pounds per acre. There will be about 35,000 acres of peanuts harvested in Eastland County according to the ASCS figures.

Ross Wilson, Manager of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Assn. said the state wide peanut crop will be the best ever. Most local buying stations report better than average grades which means the quality is improved.

The Pioneer Farmers Cooperative says grades are running from 65 to 78, but mostly between 70 and 75. There are considered very good

grade Gordon said. Peanut harvest for the State has reached 75 percent completion compared with 47 percent a year ago at this time. Yield prospects are excellent and digging has been helped by recent rains that have loosened some light soils the county

I personally feel that Eastland needs some sort of a modern, properly equipped, gathering place, whether it be a 'civic center" or a Coliseum such as Snyder and Brownwood have. And, it is apparent that we do need bigger and better library facilities.

What I AM against, though, is the proposed manner of paying for the \$215,000 bond issue, what with added interest means we'll be paying over one third of a million dollars over the suggested 16 year pay

I also feel there has been some misleading information put out about how much tax increase the "average" taxpayer will be faced with. However, it is true this letter that was mailed to certain persons in Eastland could have been the product of an innocent effort on the part of those who devised it.

I also object to the manner in which the election was called and foisted on the public in not following State laws and guidelines at the time the City called the election. Article 6252 - 17 of the Texas State Code, called "Notice of Public Meetings", states specifically that all duly elected governing bodies, whether they be City Commissions, School Boards, Water Supply Districts, etc., shall post with the County Clerk's office a notice, filed a minimum of three days in advance of a called meeting, the purpose of which (in this case) was to discuss the calling of a bond election to spend taxpayers money.

No such notice was filed with the Eastland County Clerk's office prior to the called session of the Eastland City Commission when it met in called session October 9, 1972. The County Clerk's records also do not reflect that a notice was filed prior to any of the special sessions which preceded the Oct. 9 session.
