The resolution follows:

RESOLUTION BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EASTLAND COUNTY WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT CALLING AN ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING FOUR DIRECTORS OF SAID DISTRICT

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Eastland County Water Supply District:

1. That an election be held on April 3rd, 1973, in the Eastland County Water supply District as created by House Bill No. 888 passed by the Fifty-First Legislature and amended by House Bill No. 845 of the Fifty-Third Legislature, for the purpose of electing four directors of Said District.

2. For the purpose of said election, the Eastland County Water Supply District is divided into two precincts. All of the territory contained in the City of Ranger shall be known as the Ranger Precinct, and all of the territory contained in the City Eastland shall be known as the Eastland Precinct.

3. The election in the Ranger Precinct shall be held in the office of the Chamber of Commerce in said City and Mr. Vernon Deffebach is hereby appointed Election Judge and he shall appoint such other clerks as he deems necessary to assist him.

3b. The election in the Eastland Precinct shall be held in the Eastland County Court House and Mr. Pat Crawford is hereby appointed Election Judge and he shall appoint such other clerks as he deems necessary to assist him.

4. Only qualified voters residing in the Eastland County Water Supply District who own taxable property in said District and have duly rendered the same for taxation shall be entitled to vote at said election.

5. Mr. M.H. Perry; Mr. H. T. Wilson; Mr. E. F. Penn and Mr. H. G. Adams, Jr., have made application to have their names printed on the ballots, and such applications are hereby granted, the ballots, however, shall contain blank spaces to permit the writing in of other names.

6. The ballots for the Eastland Precinct shall have printed thereon the following:

History of Desdemona Cemetery

The Desdemona Cemetery, one of the oldest in Eastland County, is located about one mile south of Desdemona, on State Highway 16, near the Eastland Comanche County line, in the D. W. Funderburg survey.

According to records found in the office of the county clerk Vol. 0, Page 196. The first plot of land, seventy by eighty varas, was purchased by the citizens of the Chrystal Springs School Community. For graveyard purposes, the purchase price being twelve dollars and fifty cents, was paid by the citizens of the Chrystal Springs School Community. The title was vested in the trustees of this School community and their successors in office. The grantors of this plot of land was a Mr. J. S. Jones and wife R. A. Jones. The date of the transaction was January 28, 1880. The record further sets out, by Vol. 563, Page 106, that on April 28, 1965, the cemetery was enlarged by the purchase of two

acres of land from the H. H. Williamsestate joining the old cemetery on the west. This addition as well as a new Cyclone fence that encloses the entire cemetery, was made possible by donations from the people of Desdemona and vicinity and relatives and friends of those buried there.

The entire citizenship of this community labor together in harmony and one accord, with the officials of the cemetery association working under their direction and supervision in caring for the last home of the dead and always keeping it in presentable condition. Gordon pot

Need more rain? Farmers say no, but some livestock men say they are low on stock water. Most of our rains this winter have been light, the kind that soak deep into the soil. These kind of rains do not fill tanks.

There was standing room only at the vegetable and fruit meeting in Eastland on February 27th. Dr. John Larsen and B. G. Hancock presented some good information. We still have publications of most of the materials presented if anyone needs it.

Dr. Larsen said that the greatest polluters were not farmers who sprayed their crops and livestock with pesticides but people living in urban areas. Studies have shown that streams and underground water in urban areas have more pesticides in them than those in rural areas. He said people usually apply more chemicals than needed on lawns and home gardens. Many times they do not read labels and they apply pesticides that should not be used on the vegetables or plants being treated. If they have pesticides left over they dump the remains into the sewage system.

It's about time to spray your fruit trees to prevent worms and other insects. If you have a small orchard or even a few trees you should spray according to the following schedule using malathion and wettable sulfur.

The first spray should be applied when 75 percent of the petals have fallen. A second application is made ten days later. The third application is put on ten to fourteen days after the second application and the fourth spray applied fourteen days after the third.

Malathion controls the insects while sulfur controls diseases such as Brown rot. These materials are safe when used as directed.

We are going to try some new varieties of fruit trees in the county. We have ten plum trees and five peach trees that will be planted in various areas of the county this year. The plum is known as P-113 and will be named sometime in the future. It promises to be the best large plum available today. The new peach has been named as Miliam and is a good red mid-season peach. They will be tested both in commercial orchards and in yards.

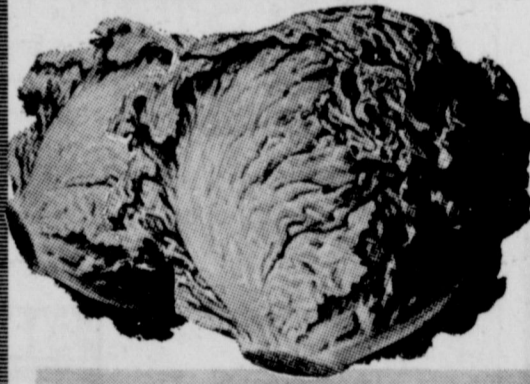

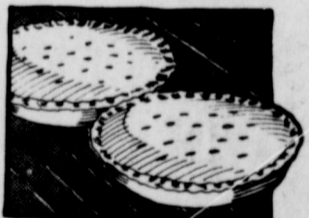
Use flat-bottomed pans

The flatter the pan the better the contact with the electric unit. Also, be sure the pans have tight-fitting lids to reduce cooking time and moisture loss. And match pan size to unit size to avoid heat loss.

can be cooked with little or no water. Once water starts to boil, use the lowest heat setting that will keep it boiling.

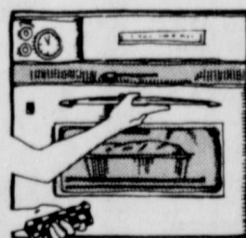
Cook and freeze

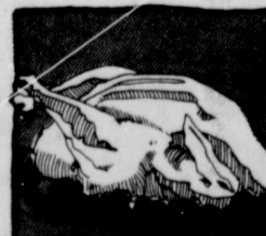
Don't open the oven door unnecessarily
