On this, the 15th, day of February 1973, the Board of Directors of the Eastland County Water Supply District convened in regular session in Ranger, Texas, with the following members present, to- wit:

Constituting a quorum, at which time the following proceedings were had:

Director Perry introduced a resolution and made a motion that it be adopted. The motion was seconded by Director Weaver. The motion carrying with it the adoption of the resolution prevailed by the following vote: AYES: ALL NAYS: NONE

The resolution follows:

RESOLUTION BY BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EASTLAND COUNTY WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT CALLING AN ELECTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF ELECTING FOUR DIRECTORS OF SAID DISTRICT

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Eastland County Water Supply

1. That an election be held on April 3rd., 1973, in the Eastland County Water supply District as created by House Bill No. 888 passed by the Fifty-First Legislature and amended by House Bill No. 845 of the Fifty-Third Legislature, for the purpose of electing four directors of Said District.

For the purpose of said election, the Eastland County Water Supply District is divided into two precincts. All of the territory contained in the City of Ranger shall be known as the Ranger Precinct, and all of the territory contained in the City Eastland shall be known as the Eastland Precinct.

The election in the Ranger Precinct shall be held in the office of the Chamber of Commerce in said City and Mr. Vernon Deffebach is hereby appointed Election Judge and he shall appoint such other clerks as he deems necessary to assist him.

3b. The election in the Eastland Precinct shall be held in the Eastland County Court House and Mr. Pat Crawford is hereby appointed Election Judge and he shall appoint such other clerks as he deems necessary to assist him.

Only qualified voters residing in the Eastland County Water Supply District who own axable property in said District and have dule rendered the same for taxation shall be entitled to vote at said election.

5. Mr. M.H. Perry; Mr. H. T. WilsonMr. E. F. Penn and Mr. H G. Adams, Jr., have made application to have their names printed on the ballots, and such applications are hereby granted, the ballots, however, shall contain blank spaces to permit the writing in of other

Need more rain? Farmers say no, but some livestock men say they are low on stock water. Most of our rains this winter have been light, the kind hat soak deep into the soil. These kind of rains do not fill

There was standing room only at the vegetable and fruit neeting in Eastland on February 27th. Dr. John Larsen and B. G. Hancock presented some good information. We still have publications of most of the materials presented if anyone needs it.

Dr. Larsen said that the greatest polluters were not farmers who sprayed their crops and livestock with pesticides but people living in urban areas. Studies have shown that streams and underground water in urban areas have more pesticides in them than those in rural areas. He said people usually apply more chemicals than needed on lawns and home gardens. Many times they do not read labels and they apply pesticides that should not be used on the vegetables or plants being treated. If they have pesticides left over they dump the remains into the sewage system.

It's about time to spray your fruit trees to prevent worms and other insects. If you have a mall orchard or even a few rees you should spray according to the following chedule using malathion and ettable sulfur

The first spray should be pplied when 75 percent of the etals have fallen. A second pplication is made ten days ater. The third application is ut on ten to fourteen days after he second application and the ourth spray applied fourteen avs after the third.

Malathion controls the inects while sulfur controls iseases such as Brown rot. hese materials are safe when sed as directed.

Tips to help you use electricity nore efficiently for cooking.

You can get the most value from your electric range by following these tips.



Use flat-bottomed pans

The flatter the pan the better the contact with the electric unit. Also, be sure the pans have

tight-fitting lids to reduce cooking time and moisture loss. And match pan size to unit size to avoid heat loss.

Don't open the oven door unnecessarily

Opening the oven door when the oven is hot can cause heat loss and ex-

tended cooking time. It also can result in undercooking.



Use minimum amount of water

The more water you use, the longer it takes to get it not. Many foods

can be cooked with little or no water. Once water starts to boil, use the lowest heat setting that will keep it boiling.

Cook and freeze

Bake two cakes or pies, or make double recipes of such foods as stews and spaghetti sauce. Then freeze one



for future use. Also, when you're baking, prepare an oven meal at the same time so no surface cooking is necessary-simply choose foods that will cook at the same temperature.



Thaw before cooking

Thawing meats before cooking reduces cooking time. Also, when recipes call for a

preheated oven, don't turn it on too far in advance-usually 10 to 15 minutes will do.
