

Mix egg yolk, milk, quick-cooking tapioca, sait, and 2 tablespoons sugar in saucepan. Cook and stir over medium heat until mixture comes to a full boil (5 to 8 minutes). Pour a small amount of hot mixture gradually into meringue, blending well. Quickly stir in the remaining tapioca mixture. Add vanilla. Let stand 15 to 20 minutes; stir. Then whip cream and fold into tapioca cream. Chill. Serve in sherbet glasses. Sprinkle with diced preserved ginger and nuts. Garnish with additional whipped cream and a cherry, if desired. Makes 5 or 6 servings.




