

Its purpose is to cake, and doughnuts. enable groups of people to reach conclusions and to plan work in a short time and without confusion Its first rule is the first rule of etiquette which many of us learned as a cookbook exercise.

When one wishes to make or dis cuss a motion or to ask a question or give information related to the subject under discussion, he should rise and address the chair by saying, "Madam" or "Mr. President' or "Chairman", or by calling his special title if he has one. Of ourse, one should never try to obtain the floor when someone else is speaking unless the speaker is out of order or there is a real emer-

In very small informal group the member need not rise to ad dress the chair. In large groups where the members do not know each other well, the person wish ng to obtain the floor will give name and perhaps add some identifying remark to the chair, the secretary, and the other members of the group may know who is speaking. The correct form is, "Mr. President, Mrs. Richard Roe of Pike County". The chair then repeats the name. This recognition gives permission to speak.




