course or do without the car, she will also have to get Susie so Junior will have to eat later. That's not important though actually, because Junior professes two or three meals to supper anyway and his mother does know all about warped personalities and general hostility to food, the fate of small children who are forced to eat what mother cooks.

Poor Grandma lacked still another advantage that modern mothers take for granted: committee meetings. She could not work without watching the clock for she had no Mother's Meeting to attend before the P-TA started.

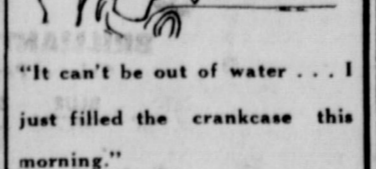

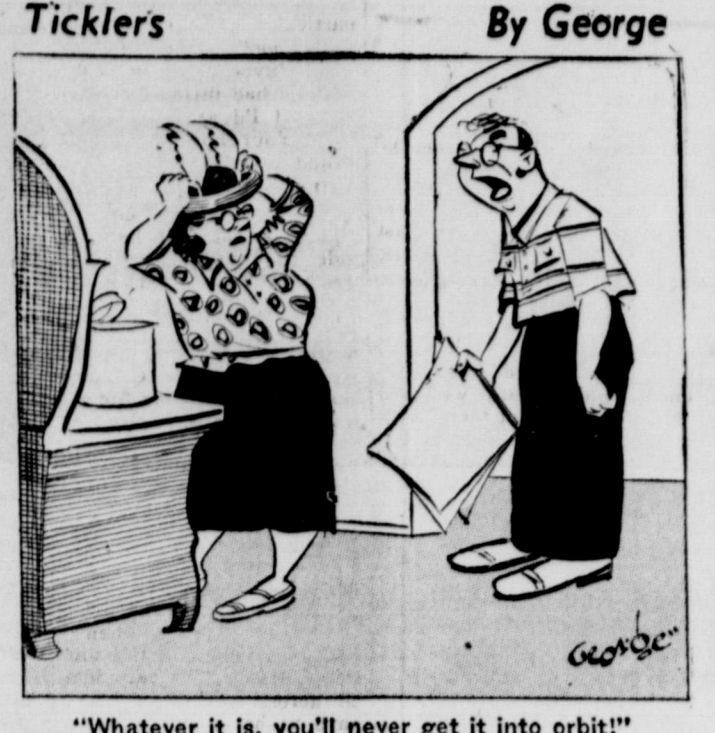
