

The huge blimps are actually airborne radar domes and house internally-mounted radar units. Designed for potential use in connection with Uncle Sam's radar warning nets, both of the flying "eyes" have a capacity of about 1,500,000 cubic feet of helium in their gas cells. Twenty-one men crew each blimp, and each is powered by two outrigger-mounted engines.
