RJC Baseball Tryouts Set Saturday, June 9

The Big Country Baseball Tryout Camp for players 17-22 years-old will be held here Saturday June 9 according to Ranger Junior College head baseball coach Jack Allen.

The camp provides participants a chance to tryout for both college and professional teams and will be held at Community Park, beginning at 9 a.m.

Professional scouts already named as camp instructors by Allen include Buster Mills of the New York Yankees; Doug Gassaway, San Francisco Giants; Mike Barbola, Philadelphia Phillies; and Don Williams, Cincinnati Reds.

COMMENTS FROM AUSTIN

By Representative Joe C. Hanna

The 63rd Legislative Session has come to an end with the possibly main bid for fame being what was not done rather than what was accomplished.

Much time in the first part of the session was spent on what generally were called the "Reform Bills". Everyone was in agreement that changes were needed, but the conflict and differences of opinion came about due to the most difficult task of covering the elected officials without including the local offices, so many of which do not receive pay, such as school boards, water boards and city councils.

In limiting lobbyists, testimony indicated the legislation would also restrict many of the people in our own districts from letting us know their views. They would have to register as lobbyists. These are just mentioned briefly to show the problems that come up without violating the Bill of Rights portion of the Constitution and restricting the right of citizens to communicate with their own Representatives.

Another aspect of this session that is apparent is that the membership of the house has not changed, overall, to be more liberal than in previous sessions. Early differences resulted from the fact that the liberal members are in

positions as chairmen of many of the committees, and thereby have more influence on legislation than they previously have had. These appointments are made by the Speaker of the House. More of the so-called liberal measures cleared committees than in the past, but very few survived the competition of a crowded Calendar and action by both houses.

The appropriations bill that spent 9.8 billion dollars for the next two years was debated on the floor of the house for two weeks. This was a record in expenditure, and the length of time spent debating this bill set a record also.

The committees have been reduced from 46-21, which would seem to be a helpful change. However, most of the 21 committees have 3 standing sub committees. The way that this has worked has put most of the members on six committees, resulting in many occasions of having three or four of these committees meeting at the same time...and, at all times, the members have gone from one committee to another, often lasting until the wee hours of the night or starting early in the morning. These problems need to be studied to relieve this duplication of timing of committee schedules. In some of the busy days of the session there were no available meeting rooms, and often committee quorums could not be had because of the conflicts.

The failure of many, many bills to be passed into law is not all bad. There are a large number of people who think that we have too many laws on our books already. I do know that I have voted "No" about 10 to 1 this session. Most of the time spent has been used to defeat or modify bills considered bad for our district or for Texas as a whole.
