## COMMENTS FROM AUSTIN By Representative Joe C. Hanna

The 63rd Legislative Session positions as chairmen of many has come to an end with the possibly main bid for fame being what was not done rather

than what was accomplished. Much time in the first part of the session was spent on what generally were called the "Reform Bills". Everyone was in agreement that changes were needed, but the conflict and differences of opinion came about due to the most difficult task of covering the elected officials without including the local offices, so many of which do not receive pay, such as school boards. water boards and city councils.

In limiting lobbyists, testimony indicated the legislation would also restrict many of the people in our own districts from letting us know their views. They would have to register as lobbyists. These are just mentioned briefly to show the problems that come up without violating the Bill of Rights portion of the Constitution and restricting the right of citizens to communicate with their won Representatives

Another aspect of this session that is apparent is that the membership of the house has not changed, overall, to be more liberal than in previous sessions. Early differences resulted fromthe fact that the liberal members are in

AUSTIN- - The Texas Department of Agriculture's light trapping program for the lesser cornstalk borer, Texas' most serious peanut insect pest, has captured the first moth for the 1973 season in the Central Texas area.

Agriculture Commissioner John C. White announced that the first moths were caught by one of the De Leon Research Laboratory's light traps on May 8. Last year's first catch was confirmed on March 13.

Commissioner White urged farmers to be on the lookout for moths and larvae in fields as soon as their peanuts and other crops are planted.

Moths and larvae may be sent to the De Leon Research Laboratory, 301 West Navarro, De Leon , Texas 76444, for identification.






