(Editor's Note: The following | faces a crisis as far as finances

are concerned. With the State Legislature in pecial session to solve the money problems, the Telegram feels it vise to study state expenditures

and state revenue receipts. Where does the State of Texas spend its money? That's a ques-

tion asked often today. A check shows that most of the money is spent for two things: education and highways and roads. The biggest expense today is education. For since 1948 the State's share of the education bill has inreased from less than \$150,000,-000 to a total of \$409,197,177 this past year.







Corn-Crisped Chicken


