



Washington — (NEA) — The nine people who worked the hardest to dream up the Administration's new "Limited Federal Health Reinsurance Plan" are divided on whether or not this scheme will work.

Chiefly responsible for the plan are Undersecretary of Health, Education and Welfare Nelson A Rockefeller and these eight east ern insurance executives: C. Manton Eddy, Connecticut General Life Ins. Co., Hartford, Conn.; Henry S. Beers, Aetna Life Ins. Co., Hartford, Conn.; Jarvis Farley Massachusetts Indemnity Ins. Co., Boston, Mass.; Dr. Charles G. H. a y d s. n. Massachusetts Blue Shield, Boston, Mass.; William S. McNary, Michigan Blus Cross, Detroit, Mich.; H. Lewis Reitz, Lincoln National Life Ins. Co., Fort Wayne, Ind.; J. Henry Smith, Equitable Life Assurance Society, New York, and James E. Stuart, Hospital Care Crop. (Blue Cross), Cincinnati, Ohio.

Stringent Economy

The federal government is still running on a deficit basis. And this year's deficit will be much larger than was anticipated, due to an unexpectedly sharp decline in tax receipts.

Moreover, some taxes have been or soon will be reduced, and there is almost universal sentiment, in and out of government, for further cuts at the earliest possible

What is the long-range solution to this complex and acute problem? The most obvious answer is: Stringent government

But that need not be the whole cure. Very great sav-

ings to the taxpayers can and should be made by getting government out of commercial undertakings undertakings which pay no taxes and almost invariably entail heavy losses.

Many - including people in important government positions - have urged, for example, that the government sell its socialized electric power projects, beginning with TVA, to private taxpaying enterprise. This would bring millions into the Treasury — and save billions in the future, by getting rid of the annual subsidies, and by putting the projects on the tax rolls where they belong. They are wholly or largely tax-free now.

At the very least, all new proposed socialized power schemes should be stoped cold. An example is the pending \$400,000,000 hydroelectric project at Niagara Falls. A group of regulated, business-managed utilities wants to undertake this - and if they are allowed to they'll not only build and operate it without tax subsidies of any kind, but they'll pay more than 20 per cent of the resultant total revenues in taxes. If government does it, on the other hand, all of us will have to chip in to pay the huge bill, there'll be no tax revenues, and the fiscal problem will be that much worse.

Yes, we need maximum economy in government. But it is equally important to get government out of commercial business and keep it out. In the meantime the advocates of socialized industry block progress in their efforts to expand government ownership of business.

Freedom Dividends

Dr. Gunnar Gundersen of La Crasse, Wisconsin, made this memorable statement in a paper read to a conference of the American Hospital Association: "Freedom has made this country strong. Its accomplishments during less than two centuries are the marvel of the modern world. Freedom has created the modern hospitals of today. They have, in large measure, grown and developed on a free, voluntary basis. Freedom has seen our voluntary hospital and medical care programs develop at a rate of speed and to a size believed to be beyond achievement, and the end is not yet in sight. Freedom has seen the development of medical science and medical practice in this country, which is second to none. Freedom has made all this possible without compulsion, without government enactment, without police action, and without licensure . . . If you and I can hold fast to freedom the future has nothing to fear.'

All the details and controversies to one side, here is the strongest possible argument against socialized medicine, government domination of medicine, or any variant thereof. It is a case where the record speaks for itself. In no other major power has there been such improvement in the health standards of the people. In no other is so vast a wealth of medical service available - measured either in terms of quality or terms of quantity. In no other have so many people voluntarily insured themselves against illness and accident — the number is now past the 100,000,000 mark. And in no other does the future hold so much promise for still greater achievement.

An Empty Howl

There was all kinds of howling when the Administration proposed, in its new tax bill, to give a little relief to people who receive income from investments. This, the cry went, meant fattening the rich at the expense of the poor.

President Eisenhower showed how empty that claim was by citing the example of one of our biggest corporations. This concern has 300,000 workers - and practically the same number of stockholders. Only 10 per cent of those stockholders had incomes of more than \$25,000 a year. Fifty-three per cent reported overall_incomes of less than \$4500 a year - and \$4500 is the average annual wage of the company's employes.

As for the tax angle, the company pays 59 cents to the federal government out of each dollar it earns as profit. And more of those earnings go to government when shareholders pay their individual income taxes,

under the present unjust system of double taxation. The big point is that the majority of stockholders in all industries with widely dispersed ownership are in the small and middle-income brackets. Many of them are industrial workers, who have invested savings in the corporations which employ them, and other enterprises. Investors, far from being unduly favored, are disproportionately toxed today.

> Arkansas' borrowing to build highways would have been all right had it been kept within reasonable bounds and had the money been spent wisely, without political considerations. But it wasn't, The big borrowing started nearly 30 years ago. First one governor and then another discovered the political magic of floating bonds to get things done without having immediately to tax the people for it. The money was spent loosely and sometimes with political design rather than wisdom.

Nose To Crindstone Quickly our state was \$150,000,-000 in debt. When unexpected hard times came, Arkansas defaulted - it couldn't meet the terms of its debt contract, and for a short time the bondholders were in serious jeopardy. The temporary injury to the state affected the welfare of every citizen, Then 15 years ago, Arkansas refunded its highway-bonded deb't and began a stiff program of debt liquidation. But under this program our debt service has been so heavy (interest and principal payments) we haven't been able to keep pace with the wear and tear on our highways.

That's why our citizens can look ahead with unbounded gladness to 1970 and the throwing off of the ball and chain of this debt. With our bonded debt out or the way, the tax revenues thus released can be used to improve the whole structure of our governmental services.

The Federal Debt Our debt situation in Arkansas is a microscopic example of some aspects of a truly grave national problem, the rising federal debt. It has become a ball and chain around our nation's neck. It is affecting the full freedom of every citizen. The national debt nowstands at \$275-billion. And yet Congress is being asked to raise the statutory limit so that the federal government can borrow new money and spend it - and postpone the day when taxpayers must pay and pay through the

The \$275-billion national debt averages an obligation of \$4,250 on every job holder in the U.S.A. And it must be paid in taxes. Not only that, but the interest, the cost of borrowing, must be paid in taxes. The interest now amounts eral government cost us as recently as 1938. Also each 12 months, about \$60-billion is needed to redeem the debts coming due; and this must be borrowed. With the debt climbing, it is an endless cycle. It all adds up to

frenzied financing. Must Halt Borrowing The sensible thing to do about budget proposed by the Administration, by just 5 per cent, Is this too much for the citizenry to ask of Congress - that 5 per cent be cut from the \$65-billion budget? Of course not!

When a family has an unexpected illness that entails medical and hospital services of \$200, it hasn't a close adviser said of him; quite as much to spend on necesities for the next few months. Does it run to borrow money? No, usually it rightens its belt, That's what our federal government should do - tighten its belt on expenditures. It should do this, and do it at once.
