



Freedom Standard

At the Constitutional Convention, George Washington declared, "If, to please the people, we offer what we ourselves disapprove, how can we afterward defend our work? Let us raise a standard to which the wise and honest can repair.

That was a statement made a long time ago in a day when the importance of freedom was more deeply ingrained in the people of the Republic than it is today when only the shell of the Republic remains in these United States. It was uttered when the morals of public figures had not acquired the tarnish of political expediency so endemic to our times.

There is need now - if our heritage of a free society is to be passed along to future generations - for a standard to which believers in freedom and limited government may rally.

Such a standard has been outlined for the Congress of Freedom by Thaddeus Ashby, chairman of the committee's policy group and editorial page editor of the Colorado Springs Gazette-Telegraph, a sister newspaper of the Pampa Daily News.

We submit the policy statement from our "wise and honest" neighbors who have a sense of the importance of freedom. It follows:

"We the people oppose the assumption that free enterprise is incapable of solving its own problems, as presumed in labor legislation which tells a man what he can do on his own property under the guise of arbitrating or preventing strikes. We believe that the Taft-Hartley Act is a direct result of extending privileges to labor unions by the Wagner Act, and that the solution to labor relations as all relations is more freedom, not more interference by government. We therefore propose and advocate repeal of all labor legislation, beginning with the Wagner Act, the National Labor Relations Board and ending with the Taft-Hastley Act, Whatever legal punishment is needed against crimes of violence perpetrated by either management or labor should be provided by the separate states.

'Taxation without limitation must be halted. Firm in this resolution we therefore believe we must stand foursquare for the complete repeal of the 16th Amendment, the Federal Income Tax!

It is not our purpose here to propose new taxes. We believe that if we abolish all foreign aid, all foreign and domestic "share the wealth" programs, the Federal Government will not need the 16th Amendment for its revenues. Other measures can be found if the government's power to spend our money is severely limited. The primary problem is not to raise money, but to reduce drastically all government spending. Repeal of the income tax amendment will do the job.

"As an Initial means of drastically abolishing expenditures, be it hereby resolved that the Government of the United States cease and desist supporting foreign governments, thereby perpetuating their forms of Communism and socialism. As a means of severing our entangling alliances with foreign nations, be it hereby highly resolved that the United States of America withdraw immediately from the United Nations!

"And as a part of an amendment to limit our treaty making power and executive agreement power, we propose a clause which will prohibit our participation in the United Nations, or any other scheme whose aim is world government at any time in the future.

"We must work to restore love of our Republic.

"To these ends we urge measures in government, education, religion, and labor which are designed to reestablish complete freedom of choice for that sacred unit of individualism, the private citizen of our Repub-

"To this end, we pledge our utmost devotion, to seek out and join other citizens of our Republic, who in the coming battle are willing to repeat the last line of the Declaration of Independence:

"We pledge our lives, our fortunes and our sacred

Nehru's Plan

Overshadowed by the Geneva conference, the recent meeting of Asiatic nations of Colombo, Ceylon, produced some developments of importance for the free world.

Above all, it was demonstrated that India, for all Its pretensions, does not lead the Asiatic countries.

Prime Minister Nehru came to Colombo with two special interests: a six-point plan for a settlement of the Indo-China war and a determination to avoid offending the Communist powers.

In neither case did he get the support he expected from the other nations. His Indo-China plan was approved in a greatly watered-down version. The conference statement on Communism represented severe compromise.

The final declaration warned off from Asia "Communist, anti-Communist and other agencies" which might seek to establish or maintain domination over any nation. Nehru did not want any condemnation to include "friendly" powers like Communist China

All the prime ministers present were agreed that co-Ionialism was a bad thing and must go. But three of them, the leaders of Pakistan, Ceylon and Burma, also agreed that Communism is at least an equal threat to

Nehru is of course governed largely by national con-terations when he urges "no offense." China, now the ull master of Tibet, sits on India's northern border.

The tragedy of his policy is that it is shortsighted. It falls to point out to the Indian people and other Asiatics that Communism in actual practice is far worse than colonialism the Asian countries now experience or wove ever known.

The Ten Commandments

I have been reading nine different books on the Ten Commandments. They are:

Will Not Budge" by B. A. Maurer I have been trying to get a book on the Ten Commandments written by a Jew, but so far have not been able to find one. The part of the Ten Command-

ments that especially intersts me is the Coveting Commandment, because it seems to be a summary of the commandments on human relations and even the summary of the whole Ten Commandments. Of the books that I read on the Ten Commandments, the one I liked best was by Taylor G. Bunch.

He, I believe, is a Seventh Day Adventist. Possible I liked this book better than any of the rest because it was the first of the nine that I read.

Under the chapter on "The Sin of Covetousness" Taylor C. Bunch writes.

"Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's house, thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife, nor his manservant, nor his maidservant, nor his ox, nor his ass, nor anything that is thy neighbor's.' Exodus 20:17.

"Covetousness implies a sense of delight in, and desire to possess, some object, especially by unjust and unlawful means. It is to set the heart on something belonging to another and to which one has no right without an adquate return for the value received. In an evil sence covetousness is inordinate desire or affection. In the New testament it is often translated 'desire,' 'lust,' and 'concupiscence.' It is a desire to possess what is now lawfully obtainable.

"It the desired object can be obtained lawfully, it is not a sin to desire what we do not possess, It is wrong to covet when the thing desired is out of reach through legitimate means. It is a sin to want my neighbor's property to the extent that I would get it by almost any means. Covetousness is concentrated selfishness and is universally condemned throughout the Scriptures.

"The other nine commandments have to do chiefly with the outward conduct - with overt acts. But the tenth reaches into the inner life and regulates the motives that give birth to deeds. The thoughts are the parents of the acts. This command may therefore be transgressed without the knowledge of others. It is the most heart searching of all the commands of the law. The thoughts cautious Congress. Summary of the Law Since covetousness is the sin tenth commandment is a summary, not only of the second table of the decalogue, but of the whole law. The violation of this precept may lead to the transgression of every other. Covetousness is the fountain from which flow the poisonous streams of idolatry, hypocrisy, Sabbath desecration, disobedience to parents, murder, fornication, stealing, and lying or the bearing of false witness.

Differ Greatly The book "The Ten Commandments Will Not Budge" by B. A. Maurer is the one that it seems to me presents the least rational interpretation of the commandments, Mr. Maurer in commenting on the commandment "Thou shalt not steal" seems to think that any individual who accumulates a half million dollars is a thief. Since this belief is more or less popular, I want to quote from this book in another article and attempt to show how Mr. Maurer misinterprets the coveting and stealing commandments.




