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New Security Hearings Set By McCarthy

It Is Predicted Senator Will Use More 'Restraint'

WASHINGTON, March 1—UP—Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy opened new hearings on Army security Monday with Republican Sen. Karl E. Mundt predicting he will show "greater restraint" in questioning witnesses from now on.

McCarthy summoned his investigating subcommittee into closed session while the repercussions from his feud with Army Secretary Robert T. Stevens were still buffeting the Republican party and its administration.

McCarthy said Pvt. Marvin Balak, New York; Sgt. Rubenstein, Fort Banks, Winthrop, Mass., and "probably" a major would be questioned about Army loyalty oaths.

Oil Field Worker Suffers Injuries

A Pampa oil field worker was in the emergency x-ray room of Highland General Hospital here late this morning after suffering injuries in an oil field accident.

Gurvas J. Epps, 585 N. Russell, was rushed to the hospital in a Duane-Kern ambulance after he was injured when a derrick apparently fell on him near the Skelly-Crawford plant about 27 miles northwest of Pampa.

Only meager details were available, those coming from a man who was not an eye witness to the accident. He said that a crew had raised the derrick and were putting the safety clamps in place when the derrick apparently fell.

He said he understood the accident occurred about 11 a. m. Extent of his injuries had not been determined late this morning.

No Survivors In Air Crash

WRIGHT, Wyo., March 1—UP—A ground party radioed Monday it had reached the wreckage of a Western Airlines Convair which crashed three days ago and there were no survivors among the nine persons aboard.

Sheriff Carl Thomzig said the plane had smashed into the side of a small ravine on Black Thunder Creek at a point about 13 miles east of here, where the big, twin-engine plane's pilot had reported his position during a blinding snowstorm last Friday.

The plane's wreckage was spotted by aerial observers after a three-day search in mid-afternoon Sunday.

The scene of the crash was six miles west of the Keating Ranch headquarters and 35 miles west of the ranch that reported Friday they had heard a plane about the time the crash was reported.

Naguib Visit Incites Riot

KHARTOUM, Sudan, March 1—UP—Twenty-five persons were reported killed Monday in a battle between police and spear-wielding anti-Egyptian rioters on the arrival of President Mohammed Naguib of Egypt to a new parliament.

LONDON, March 1—UP—A British news agency reported a score of tribesmen and police were killed Monday in a riot touched off by the visit of Egyptian President Mohammed Naguib to the Sudan.

An exchange telegram dispatch said 20 persons had been killed and 117 injured, 22 seriously, in the violent demonstration at the governor general's palace.

The UMEMA (independence) party supporters shouted "long live the independence of the Sudan" while supporters of the pro-Egyptian Nationalist party screamed "long live the unity of the Nile."

When Naguib's plane landed at Khartoum airport, tribesmen outside the field shouted "no Britain, no Egypt."

The Sudan, which has been administered by the British, must decide within the next three years whether it wishes to become an independent state or unite with Britain or Egypt.

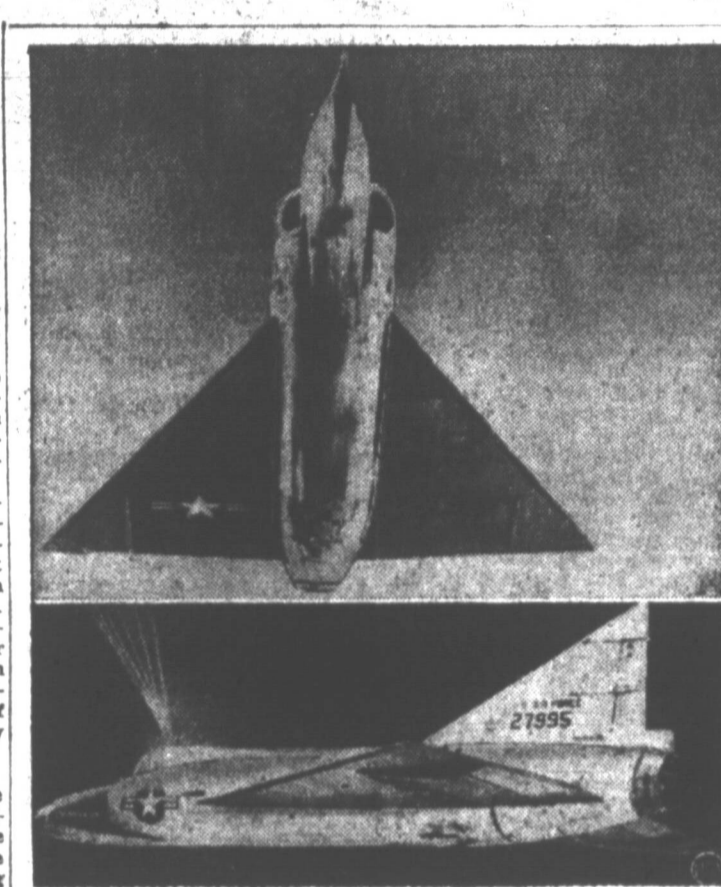
Martin said the House leadership expects to have tax legislation on the floor within two weeks.

Diplomats Gather For Pan-Am Talks

CARACAS, Venezuela, March 1—UP—Diplomats from the United States and 19 other Western Hemisphere nations assembled Monday with security forces standing by to prevent repetition of the Communist-inspired violence which took hundreds of lives at a similar meeting in Colombia in 1948.

Security Forces Altered Veneziuela security forces were alerted to thwart any Communist backed effort to disrupt the meeting.

Rebels Hiding In Indo-China

SAIGON, Indo-China, March 1—UP—French pilots, blasting retreating Communists with American-built fighter-bombers, reported Monday that the jungles north of the Laotian capital of Luang Prabang were almost clear of rebel forces.

Syria Quiet After Coup

DAMASCUS, Syria, March 1—UP—Syria was relatively quiet Monday after four days of revolution and rioting which claimed a dozen lives, and the capital reported a triumphal entry for the new president, aging Dr. Hashim El-Atassi.

WASHINGTON, March 1—UP—The Senate Monday confirmed the nomination of Earl Warren as Chief Justice by voice vote.

WASHINGTON, March 1—UP—The Senate was ready to confirm Earl Warren as chief justice Monday but there was a backlogs argument about how to do it and a new demand for an FBI report.

Senate Republican leader William F. Knowland (R-Cal.) said he intended to ask for a roll call vote. But some Senate leaders who fear this might provoke some opposition were quietly pressing for a voice ballot.

Chairman William Langer of the Senate Judiciary committee meanwhile said the Senate "should" get a full FBI report on the former California governor before confirming his nomination.

Rural Road Sought By Hooverites

Two Hoover residents, Dick Walker and Joe L. Lewis, late this morning were before Gray County Commissioners' Court, presenting a 90-name petition and explaining why Hoover residents would like a farm-to-market road from U. S. Hwy. 80 through Gray County.

Walker, the spokesman, said there was "great need" for such a road and added he thought it was the first time such a request had been made.

Commissioners had passed three motions by late this morning. The first concerned the granting of a permit to the Phillips Pipeline Company, giving them an option to cut or go under county roads.

Concern Grows Over Pius XII

VATICAN CITY, March 1—UP—The Vatican City newspaper Osservatore Romano said Monday, on the eve of Pope Pius XII's 76th birthday, that his "hoped-for cure will take quite a long time."

A one-paragraph statement in the authoritative Vatican newspaper gave new warning of the seriousness of the pope's condition as Roman Catholics prayed for the third day, for his recovery.

The pope's illness has been diagnosed officially as gastritis. But his physicians are waiting for him to gain sufficient strength so that he can undergo X-ray examination for the second time to determine whether his ailment may be more serious.
