

We Don't Want It

We're still working on the "State of the Nation" address of President Eisenhower which has provided a good deal of editorial fodder since it was presented to Congress.

Today's piece is concerned with the recommendation of the President that we boondoggle away several hundred million dollars worth of American production and sweat to provide the St. Lawrence Seaway which Eisenhower says we need for "security as well as economic reasons." This is pure bosh and lke knows it.

The St. Lawrence Seaway won't add one bit to our national security and will weaken our security by the amount of production that is required to pay for the

First of all, and the Seaway proponents don't attempt to deny it, the Seaway will be ice-bound for four or five months of the year and for that length of time will be at no use to anyone except skaters. So if the enemy that is lurking around the corner wants to attack during those winter months the Seaway won't mean a thing one way or another - other than the expense. Second, even in the summer months when the Seaway is a going concern hauling ore and grain, there are several dozen highly vulnerable locks in the Seaway (it's like a canal in this respect) that would destroy the usefulness of the waterway for a long period of time if struck by an

On top of all this, In the event of a shooting war on or near our borders, it is not likely that the military timetable will be permitted to adjust itself to the slow hauling time required by the boats.

It apparently is not generally understood that authority for U. S. participation with Canada in the construction of the Seaway has already been given. Today the total is \$316,000,000 and while it is not federal money it is State of New York money and the state is still a part of the United States.

The 'St. Lawrence Seaway" project has been presented for more than 30 years in various guises. It is presented now not as a "seaway" to open up the Great Lakes to ocean-going vessels requiring a deep passage but as a ferry service from Seven Islands, Quebec, to Cleveland, Toledo and Ashtabula Ohio. And the whole thing has been neatly wrapped into a single package by lawyers for the six steel plants that have invested in the iron are mines and development in Labrador.

This ferry service for the seven months it can operate. would permit the Canadian grain vessels to move on to Montreal. Eighty per cent of the grain shipped over the Great Lakes is Canadian The iron are that would move from Seven Islands is Canadian. Canada wants to do the work required and should do it and has been doing it for more than 100 years. We think Canada ought to go ahead with it without American dollars.

The serious question is whether it would be several hundred million dollars worth of desirable.

In buying what is cautiously described as a "desirable position for \$105,000,000 (and who doubts that it would cost more?), we are embarking upon a fantastic adventure, the cost of which is seemingly endless. Aside from the additional cost of extending the so-called "seaway" to all the Great Lakes and of deepening and improving the Great Lakes harbors, the operators of Great Lakes vessels have already said they would need subsidies in order to be able to compete with the cheaper operated foreign vessels. And Senator Potter of Michigan, one of the proponents of this project, is already moving to relieve some of their plight by restricting commerce on the



One of the main arguments for socialized electric power is that it is the only way to provide the service at low cost. The implication is made that priyate power is excessively expensive. The facts disprove any such

As of a recent date, the general cost-of-living index was 90 per cent above the 1935-39 base. Yet the cost of residential electricity was eight per cent BELOW that base, and, on the average, cost 2.77 cents a kilowatt-hour,

How about industry? The cost of purchased electric power by manufacturing industries in 1939 equaled 1.41 per cent of the total product value of those industries. The figure is now estimated at six tenths of one per cent of the product value - a drop of more than half. In the vast majority of homes and businesses, the cost

advocating an enlargement of the welfare state, then read his recent address to Congress on his methods of having the federal government be responsible for housing, directly or indirectly, a large part of the American people, When one reads this speech, he is convinced that Eisenhower believes in the economic interpretation of history: that he believes that men are bad because they are poor and they are good because they are comfortable. But his philosophy is just the opposite from that of Jesus when He said:

"It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich man to enter into the kingdom of God.'

Evidently Eisenhower has entirely forgotten the admontion of Moses that man must live by the sweat of his brow. Under Roosevelt, Truman and Eisenhower, a lot of people are going to live by their votes. They need not give value so that someone will voluntarily supply them with housing; but the federal government, by making loans at less than the free market value or making grants, will, in reality, make gifts of houses to a large number of citizens.

Contradictions Mean Nothing To

Eisenhower, doesn't seem to recognize a contradiction, or if he does, he thinks the public is too dumb to recognize it. In the fourth paragraph of his address on hous-

The federal government must provide agressive and positive leadership. At the same time actions and program must be avoided that would make our citizens increasingly dependent upon the federal government to supply their housing needs."

No living man can tell how these two statements could be in agreement. How can the government be aggressive and positive and yet not interfere with self-reliance, etc.? that has never been done down through the ages.

Is Ike More Dangerous Than

Since Eisenhower is advocating an enlargement of the welfare state and more power being put in the hands of the President than Truman advocated, one wonders whether or not Eisenhower is not really more dangerous than Truman. One reason he is more dangerous is because he has surrounded himself with successful men who tend to cause people to trust the administration. And to have trust in a dreamer who believes the state is responsible for the welfare of the individual rather than the individual, or voluntary charity being responsible for him, can lead eventually only to more poverty and more lack of freedom.


There are, of course, certain adantages and certain disadvantages in owning a home. If a working man is tied up with a home, it is more difficult for him to move to a place where he can get better wages. If a man is renting a home, the employer then must keep wages up to keep his employees. Of course, one advantage in owning a home is due to our tax laws. A man who is renting has to pay Federal taxes on the money that he receives to pay the rent, while he pays no tax to the federal government on his occupancy of a home, which in reality is income. In England they regard the occupancy of a home as income and make the owner pay taxes on it. if anyone denies that Eisenhower is advocating the increase of the welfare state, notice this sen-

"I am convinced that every American family can have a decent home if the builders, lenders and communities and the local, state and federal governments, as well as individual citizens, will pur their abilities and determination energetically to the task."

He is going to have not only the federal government, but the state and the county and local ones be taxed to provide homes. It is hard to conceive how those people who have a hard time to get a good home are going to be stimulated to make greater effort to get a home when they realize that if they are shiftless enough and vote 'right" that the government will help them get a better home than they can pay for, If that isn't promoting socialism and destroying self-reliance, nothing is.

In several places in this message Eisenhower advocates more discretion and more power being concentrated in the hands of the President, He even wants the igws passed under the Truman adminisration to be amended so that the President will have more power to xtend loans and gifts and grants. It is silly for a man to talk about balancing the budget and asking grants for around a billion dollars to help build homes and to propose that the federal government build outright 35,000 homes a year for the next four years.

Absurd Dream At the close of his message the President says that the proposal of greater loans and gifts 'shall reinforce the freedom and self-re-


