

The \$170,000,000 line will run from the Houston-Beaumont, Tex., area to Newark, N. J. At first it will move 250,000 barrels of petroleum products a day—half of its capacity.

Main line will be 1425 miles of 24 and 26-inch pipe, plus 485 miles of smaller pipe in feeder lines.



We cannot quarrel with a portion of the observation by Knebel in that the difference between the leadership the two parties is so similar in type and thinking that there is little to choose between them. But we will be slated and damned if we agree that the voter has anly these two choices. The Republican voter can, and we know a number who have said they will, refuse to vote for the candidate of either party in the coming Pres-Idential election unless there is a change in the Re--publican party. The same is true of a flock of Democrat voters who can no longer stomach the pinkies and leftwingers in that party. Any true libertarian realizes that he cannot stamp his approval on (for the sake of clarification) an Eisenhower-Stevenson ballot. Even though he might lose his vote he is better off for having refused to vote than to give support and aid to those who are determined to make some sort of a statist government out of America

We hope that by the time the election gets here there will be a party to which those of us who are disgusted with both major parties can repair. There exists in the broad general grouping of Americans who fought for the Bricker amendment a solid core of voters who can make a loud protest against New Dealism regardless of the party cloak it wears at the moment. That such a splinter group could, now or in the near future, elect a President or provide the nation with a conservative Congress is not likely. However, the success of such a movement is not necessarily based upon whether a candidate is elected to office or not but upon whether the movement provides a springboard for action and a sounding board for expressing opposition to the New

THE LAST THREE PEET By DeWitt Emery

Shortly after World War II an Industrial film was made with the rather curious title. The Last Three Feet. It dealt with the way goods flow to market through the annels of distribution - from maker to middleman to retailer to consumer. The idea for the title came from the fact that the average retail store counter is about three feet wide.

Perhaps this clever title should have one more word-The Vital Last Three Feet, because the final sales counter is the goal line of the whole economy. All the yards gained in scrimmage behind it in the process of product designing, material assembling, production, financing, transportation, warehousing and al the other moves on the economic gridiron - are or naught if the goods don't move over the goal line to the final

Thus it is that occasionally we what the business pages call an inventory recession or an over-production slump. That means the game was temporarily stalled right on the goal line. In some other business page language, it means that the pipe lines of distribution are plugged up, and again the trouble is located at this vital last three feet. The customers aren't taking the goods away fast enough on their side of the coun-ter. When this happens the proion end of the economy, no matter how efficiently it is work-

ing has to slow down. One of the greatest miracles we have achieved with our unique free enterprise economy is to make it a virtual certainty (probably for the first time in history; that our goods and services pipe lines need never get empty because we can't produce enough. We have proctically run out of problems when nes to mass produ But this production miracle of urs would never have happened, could it continue if it were not for an even greater miraclewhich is also a part of our free society and its economy—the mir-scle of the ,market place. if goods might be given away free instead of sold in such a market. We simply call it the market or a market and let it go

But to the economists and other professional observers of what goes on in a market place-or anywhere else that an exchange of goods is taking place—this matter of whether it is a free market or a controlled market is a key matter, and our own America market-the freest in the worldis indeed a miracle much taken for granted. Its freedom has great importance to us as individual consumers, and even greater importance to the success of our whole

economy. In order fully to appreciate its meaning, it is well worth considering for a moment such a simple question as What is a market? or Why markets?

Civilization was probably many centuries along its slow early path witness a strange circumstance of before there was such a thing. and the first market probably began with the first swap between two men that occured without a fight or a theft also taking place. For this first trade to happen, both men obviously had to have something of value that they could spare.

In other words, no market (at least no free choice or peaceful market) can exist until the sellers production gets beyond his own requirements and the buyer also can spare something to exchange.

Even after such crude barter exchange began, it was still centuries more before there was anything like what we would call a market. Indeed, part of the rules of survival that still exists in many parts of the world is "If you need something, make it yourself or grow it or hunt it for it in nature." (of course, there still re-mains the alternative of stealing or taking by force as the communists constantly remind us.) The essential fact here is that there can be no free market source until supply gets beyond bare needs. That was true historically and it is true today.

For Public Schools Tries To Defend Public Schools

I have only found one man holding a position of public trust who supported schools with the Golden

Now I have a letter from Samuel C. Gale, Vice Chairman of the National Citizens Commission for the Public Schools, in which he at-Rule. He gives me authority to publish his defense providing I pub lish it in toto.

I had asked Mr. Gale and all the other 35 members of the National Citizens Commission the following

1. Would it be a violation of the Golden Rule for one individual, say John Smith, to set up a school and coerce another individual, say Bob Jones, either to pay a fee for Smith's school or leave town?

2. If it is a violation of the Golden Rule for John Smith to coerce Bob Jones to help pay for Smith's school or leave town, wouldn't it be a violation of the Golden Rule for one group, say Group A, to set up a school and coerce another group, say Group B, to either help pay to support Group a's school or

3. In question 2, Group A could be a majority or it could be a minority. If it is a violation of the Golden Rule for a minority to coerce the majority either to pay a fee or leave town, why isn't it a violation of the Golden Rule for a majority to coerce a minority to either pay a fee or leave town?

Mr. Gale sent the following explanation of why he believes taxsupported schools are in agreement with the Golden Rule. Writes

"When our Society which founded the United States of America interpreted the Golden Rule in terms of a political structure and procedures (including the levying of taxes) it provided that taxes might be levied by the majority vote of the free citizens of each commu-

nity.
"The board rules for government were set down in documents called constitution of each of our 48 states it is provided that by the votes of the people in such states and the communities within such states, taxes can properly be levied for the purpose of public education. "There is further provision that

these constitutions may be changed by the votes of the people. But as they were originally conceived in the terms of the political interpretation of the Golden Rule by the founders of our Society, they can so be accepted today until the people of our Society decide, by majority vote and in accordance with legal processes set down, to

> Dead Men Cannot Questions

It will be noted that Mr. Gale France of Paris. makes no attempt himself to answer questions, but simply refers to the politicans who wrote the various constitutions of the states. Most of these men, if not all, are dead and cannot explain, if they ever did how they drew the conclusion that public schools were in agreement with the Golden Rule. To use dead men as an authority and then refuse to try to defend their philosophy is certainly a strange and arbitrary way of trying to prove that an act is in agreement with the Golden Rule. One can prove most anything by this method. They can even prove that slavery was in agreement

with The Golden Rule. After patient years of trying I have yet to find anyone who believes in public schools who is willing to answer these questions. On the other hand, those who have given sufficient thought to the question of morality of public schools are perfectly willing to answer any and all questions without evasion for they realize that there is no way that a belief in public schools can be harmonized

with the Golden Rule. It is generally conceded by those who have given a great deal of thought to moral questions taat moral laws are eternal - they do not change with time or place. Man does not make moral law and cannot alter it. If man disabeys moral law, he suffers the consequences. But Mr. Gale seems to put the laws made by man above Nature's or God's laws. He seems to deny Peter and the Apostles' statement

"We ought to obey God rather

than man.' Here we have the vice-chairman of the National Citizens Commission for the Public Schools putting the laws of man above the laws of God. He is in reality contending that we can serve two masters or he completely repudiates God's laws and prefers to worship and obey the changeable will of men. Constitution Sanctioned
