standing in front of the huge portrait to have their snapshots standing in front of the huge portrait to have their snapshots
taken
"That picture took a month to do." Wang said. What most people do not realize, he said, is that the two painters must
produce several such portraits at year, to be hung at
Communist Party conlerences and other special state produce several such portraits a year, to be hung at
Communist Party conferences and other special state
occasions. Cccasions.
Wang, married with four children, says he earns about $\$ 75$ a
monte He is a member of the Commuist Party Ge, shy and deferential to his elderir partner. is single and lives with his parents. He said he earns about halr what Wang

"Not because I have better experience," Wang said. "It's because I've worked longer than hin.
They said in an interview at their d Peking that they are busier now becass workplace in north painting Mao portraits to be sold as souvenirs at statery.

    NEW YORK (NEA) - It has been 26 years since I abandoned
