The computers are coming to Pampa's schools

| EDITOR'S NOTE: On Tuesday night the board of trustees of the Pampa Independent School District voted to accept a number of recommendations suggested by its Long-Range Planning Committee. One of the developments is a plan to incorporate "computer literacy" into the public school system. $\begin{aligned} & \text { By LARRY HOLLIS } \\ & \text { Staff Writer } \\ & \text { nd faculty in the } \end{aligned}$ <br> Students, staff and faculty in the Pampa public school system all will receive computer instruction and use skills starting with the next school year as Pampa moves toward instituting computer training at all levels, an action approved by the school board this week <br> The program will be introduced in several steps. <br> The cost is so great we can't do it all at once." said John English, assistant superintendent of schools. <br> The introduction of computer use throughout the school system is one of the sweeping changes recommended by the Long-Range Planning Committee, headed by school board member Ken Fields <br> The plan for implementation of computer use "gives us flexibility to change directions." English said New computers will be purchased over the next several years. | allowing for changes in software in the growing computer industry <br> Initially, the elementary schools will receive the main thrust of implementing the new program <br> First priority, according to a report submitted to and approved by the board. will go to supplying computers for use in the fourth grade classes, beginning with the 1984-1985 school year Software will be acquired for use in the language arts classes. with at least one computer purchased for each fourth grade class. Computers in each building will rotate a mong the classrooms. <br> Due to the limited number of computers initially available, students will have to be rotated between the computers and other lessons on the days when the computers are in the rooms. the report indicated Some of the software to be selected should be suitable for group work. allowing more than one student to be at each computer. <br> The committee suggested particular attention should also be paid to software for remedial use and for use by advanced students. <br> When the computers are not in use by the fourth grade they will be available for use by other teachers in the building especially by the third and fifth grades and | special programs <br> The committee recommended the second priority be to increase the number of computers available for the eighth grade Computer Awareness course and the high school Computer Math course. Buth courses should begin expanding beyond the current enrollments when more computers are purchased. <br> The third priority is to begin evaluation of software for special education purposes, using dedicated special education funds to purchase software and hardware, the committee suggested <br> During the next school year, additional plans will be made for the expansion of computer use into other areas in the school system. Teachers and coordinators will determine the needs in each subject area. including software evaluation, visits to other schools using computers and attendance at teacher conventions <br> The program calls for computer use in the elementary schools to spread from the fourth grade to the third and fifth grades. Eventually, computer use will reach all of the grades from kindergarten through the fifth. <br> The committee noted plans need to be made next year concerning the placement of the computers, with emphasis on the question of computer labs versus mobile computers | Students in the middle school will be tested to determine their competency in the required computer literacy course at the end of the sixth grade. The test will determine which students need further exposure to the computer to meet the state's requirements. Students failing the test will take a computer literacy course during the seventh grade <br> Students new to the local school system in the seventh or eighth grades not able to pass the literacy test should be placed in either the literacy course or the Computer Awareness course. depending on their math abilities, the committee recommended <br> The committee suggested the high school Computer Math course be expanded gradually beyond the three current sections. Additionally, either a data processing course or an introduction to programming course should provide an alternative for students in the academic track. <br> Upon full implementation by 1987-1988, a lab of at least 12 computers will be needed for these two programs the committee reported Due to the number of other potential uses for computers in both the business and math departments. it may become necessary to establish <br> See COMPUTERS, Page two |

| separate labs for each department <br> The committee recommended coordinators and teachers at the secondary level should look more closely at ways in which computers could be used to better teach their subjects Interested teachers should be encouraged to use computers in their classes as often as feasible This will help provide greater computer literacy for the students and help in making choices about future expansion of computer use beyond the current computer courses <br> To begin getting ready for more widespread computer use in the school system. staff and faculty will be involved in computer training workshops over the next several months A two-level training program will be instituted. according to the committee's report <br> The first level will consist of a six-hour workshop for all professional staff to cover general computer capabilities, concentrating on specific software currently available in the system This will include word processing. administrative aids such as grade averaging programs, worksheet and puzzle generators and educational software for classroom use <br> The goal for the first workshop will be to provide the staff with some specific skills on the computer to acquaint them with the equipment and to help them get comfortable with computer use <br> Pampa man injured <br> in fall from oil rig <br> A 26 - year - old Pampa man was listed in good condition at Coronado Community Hospital this morning after falling from an oil rig Thursday <br> Mike Bresee said this morning he is sore, but feeling all right after falling from a rig he was helping move. Teachers who will need this workshop should complete it prior to Aug. of the school year in which they will begin using the computers <br> These workshops should be completed by all fourth grade teachers at least one month prior to the time the computers will begin use in their classrooms to allow sufficient time for the teachers to familiarize themselves with the software <br> The committee suggested a district-wide coordinator programs. <br> Initially, the coordinator would have widespread responsibilities to work with teachers in the workshops. form and direct committees to select software, prepare bid maintain a software library. In addition, the coordinator would provide on-call assistance to schools during the school day. keep an inventory of computer hardware and prepare computer budgets to include both software and hardware <br> The coordinator also would consult with teachers and subject coordinators to develop specific plans for implementing computer use beyond 1984-1985. <br> After three years, the committe indicated, the coordinator's job would concern mainly preparing the budget and bid requests, maintaining the inventory list and software library, and providing training early in the year for teachers new to the system <br> In addition, the committee recommended a "contact person" should be designated at each elementary school to become the school's expert on computers. If the contact person cannot handle computer problems at the school, then the district-wide coordinator would be called. This person should attend both levels of workshop training prior to the start of the 1984-1985 school year. <br> The other major action recommended in the committee's report was that software selection process should begin as early as possible, preferably this month. |
