two activities：advocacy of new programs aimed at giving or doing something for some particular segment of the population；or，advocacy of new laws that prevent
citizens from doing something the politicians don＇t want citizens from doing something the politicians don＇t want
them to do，or force citizens to do things the politicians In the first case，a politician who supports programs that are supposed to help some citizens must be willing to take money from other citizens in order to pay for the programs（Mrs．Ferraro recently described such
activity as＂Christian＂）．In the second case，the politician must be willing to
behave as the politician wishes．
In other words，to be a successful politician at the
national level，one must either be a thief or a dictator，or both
Party＇s vice presidential candidate is as the Democratic success story that inspires other women to become thieves and dictators，we do not consider that a step
forward for womankind in particular or the country in general．
If either of the political parties ever nominate a person for president or vice president who really believes that government has no right to take from one citizen and
give to another，or who really understands that government has no business controlling the lives of
citizens，then we will lead the applause，whether that candidate is man or woman．
