# Weight lifting Granny

GRAND BLANC, Mich. (AP) — Minnie Roberts' husband winced the first time he watched his 66-year-old wife hoist 220 pounds in a national weightlifting meet.

But Bob Roberts had no fear she might hurt herself: "I was afraid she was going to get knocked out of the competition," he said.

Mrs. Roberts, a tiny, white-haired grandmother of three from Grand Blanc Township near Flint, went on to nab a national title last year in her age division of 40 years and older.

"I shut my eyes and grit my teeth — it's a thrill," she said in a recent interview.

Mrs. Roberts started lifting weights two years ago, when she was 64, at a gymnasium her son built at his farm in Groveland Township.

Her son showed her the correct way to wrap her knees and how to loosen up her muscles by working out. Then she learned the proper method of lifting weights. Two months later, Mrs. Roberts entered her first meet in Flint.

"I went out there like it was nothing," she

said. At that meet, she dead lifted 175 pounds, squat lifted 135 and bench pressed 55.

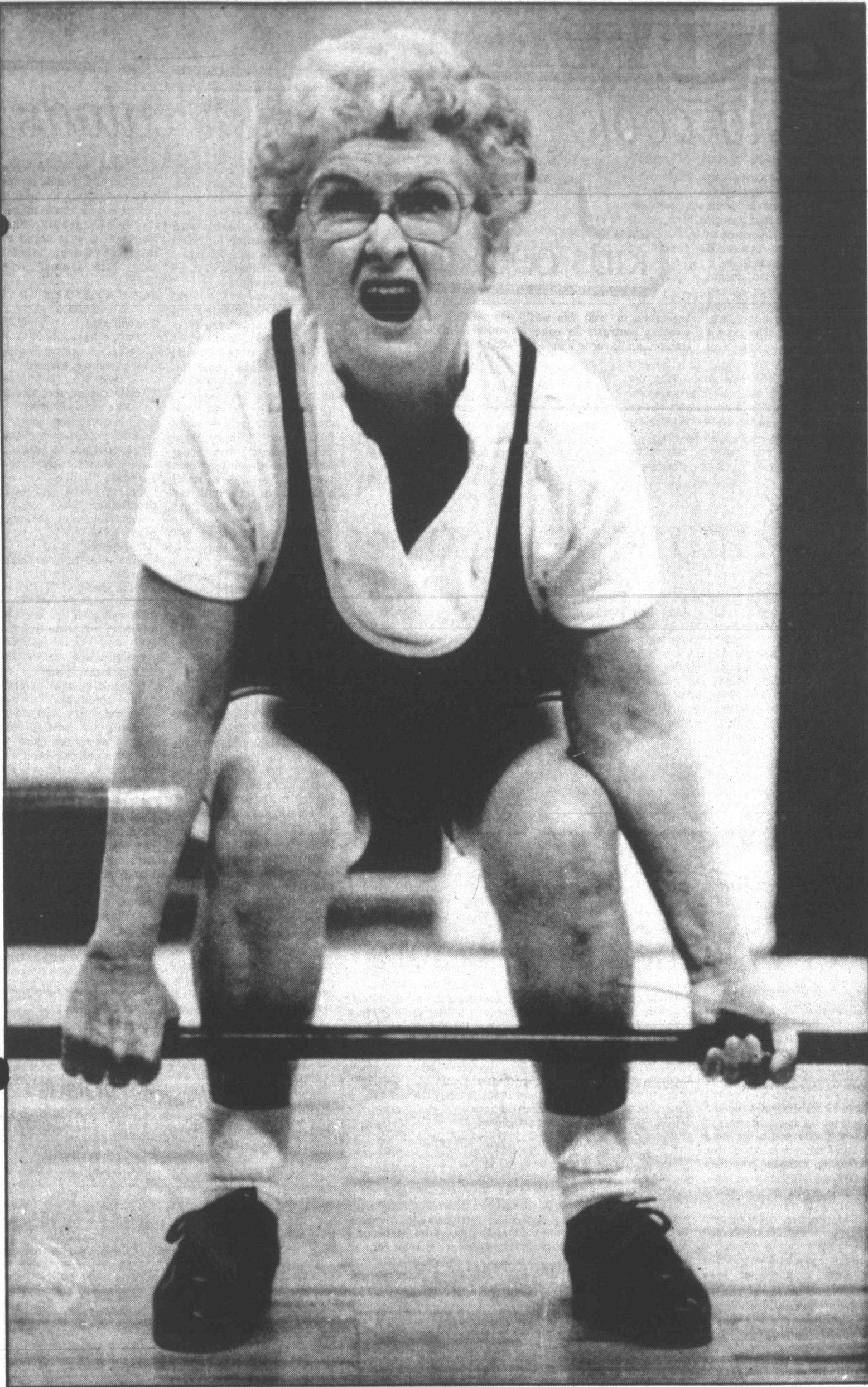
Now, Mrs. Roberts can deadlift 220 pounds and bench press 90. Her best squat was 185 pounds, a remarkable 67 pounds more than her own 118-pound weight.

She said she often draws strange looks from friends. But Mrs. Roberts, who once operated a dairy farm with her husband, said she has always been active, in bowling, golfing and swimming, and has stopped worrying about being the oldest person at the meets.

She has earned medals and trophies at local, national and state meets. Last October, she took first place at a national meet in Syracuse, N.Y., for her age group.

Lifting weights has added little weight to Mrs. Roberts' 4-foot-11-inch frame. She said she had added four pounds to her previous weight of 114, but it was mostly muscle gain. And she doesn't diet — that would cause a loss of strength.

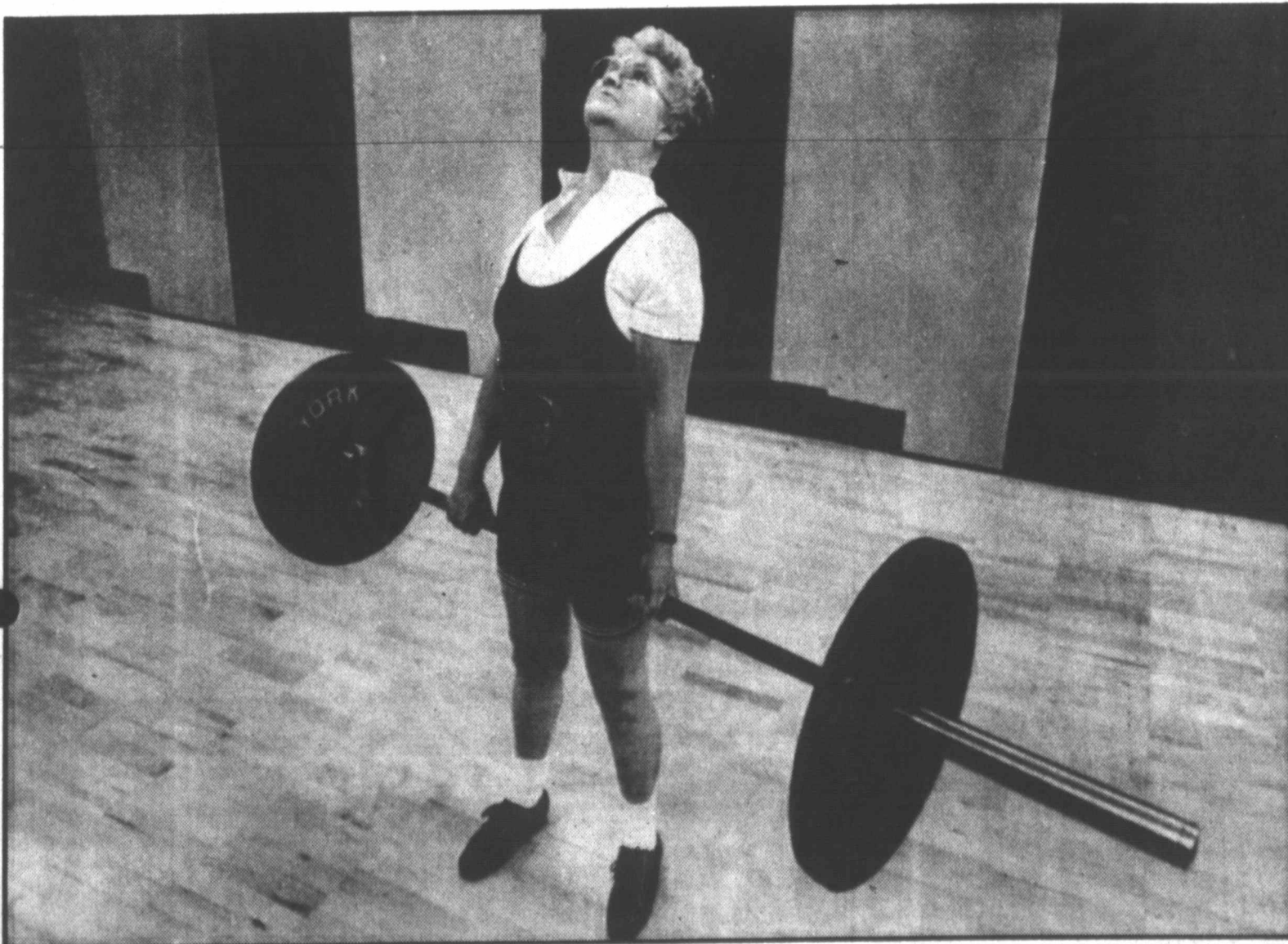
Her goal? To keep lifting weights "just as long as I can."

### Diamond M show planned for Canyon museum exhibit

CANYON - The 63rd annual meeting of the Panhandle - Plains Historical Society is to begin at the museum in Canyon on May 5 with a special exhibit of paintings, drawings, lithographs and sculpture from the Diamond M Museum in Snyder.

"The exhibit includes paintings by Texas and New Mexico artists, such as Joseph Imhof and Joseph Fleck, as well as works by noted western artists W.H.D. Koerner, W.R. Leigh, Harold Von Schmidt, N.C. Wyeth and Joseph Henry Sharp," said Carol CLine, the museum's curator of exhibits. It also features several Currier and Ives lithographs and sculptures by Frank Hoffman, George Phippen, Pierre Mene, Rosa Bonheur and other noted artists, she said.

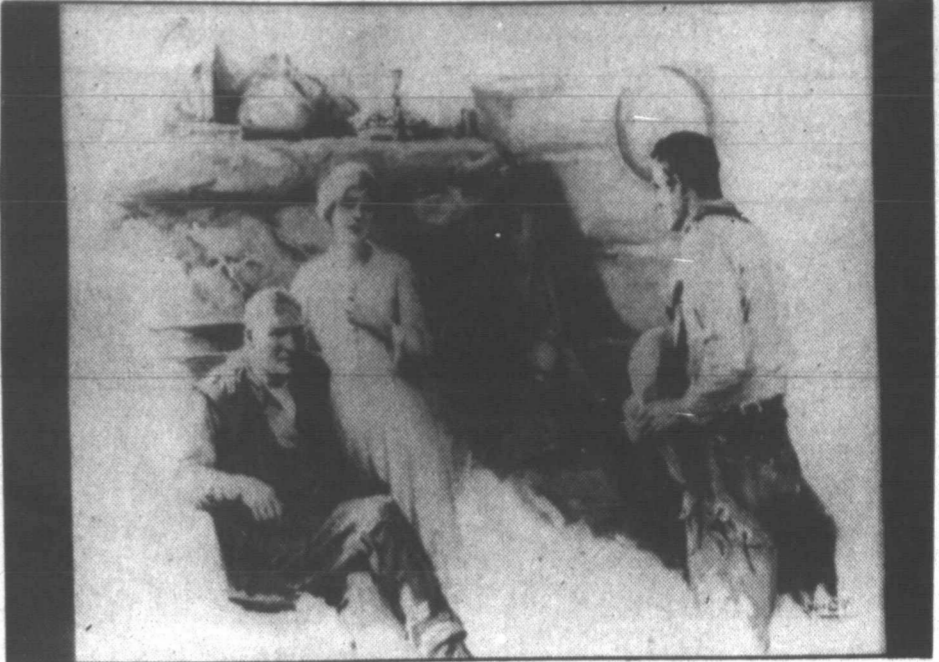
The Diamond M Museum was founded by C.T. McLaughlin in 1964 in Snyder. McLaughlin was born in 1897 in an area of Pennsylvania which produced the world's first commercial oil well, and the production of oil played a large part in his life from boyhood onward. After serving in the 503rd Aero Squadron during World War One, McLaughlin moved to Wichita Falls where he

founded a drilling company, he and his wife, Evelyn Claire Littleton, founded the Diamond M Ranch in Scurry County in 1946.

From the 1930s onward the McLaughlins were collectors of art. When their collection outgrew their home, they founded the Diamond M Museum. The museum is now supported by the Diamond M Foundation and is managed by Western Texas College.

McLaughlin and his family collected what most appealed to them. The purpose of the current traveling exhibit is to show the diversity and scope of the collection. Works representative of major areas of the collection are included. Art of the American West, from the late 19th century to the present, is the largest category. McLaughlin was particularly interested in Texas artists whose careers were developing. There is a small group of English and European paintings and sculpture in the show.

"Art from the Diamond M" is to be exhibited in the north gallery of the Panhandle - Plains Historical Museum from May 5 through June 30.

### Chiquita looks for top banana

By GENE SCHROEDER AP Newsfeatures Writer NEW YORK (AP) — Elsa Miranda is a Latin from Manhattan who once was a top banana. Now she's aiding in a search for a new top banana.

As the famous "Chiquita Banana," Miss Miranda helped make a jukebox hit of one of radio's first singing commercials some 40 years ago — a song whose lyrics offer advice a little out of date now.

"I'm Chiquita Banana and I've come to say," the lyrics began. "bananas have to ripen in a certain way...."

"Bananas like the climate of the very, very tropical equator.

"So you should never put bananas in the refrigerator."

The new Chiquita, to be selected in New York from nine regional finalists early this summer, will be singing a slightly different tune, now telling consumers that once bananas have ripened it's OK to keep them in the refrigerator.

Entrants in the talent search, in addition to possessing singing ability, must create a hat best

typifying a contemporary Miss Chiquita, with judging to be on the basis of imaginative design, poise, articulate manner and outgoing personality. The winner will probably have a busy life if she follows in the footsteps of Miss Miranda.

In her banana days, Miss Miranda (no relation to Carmen) sang the calypso-style jingle with the Boston Pops Symphony, appeared as a guest star on the top radio shows of the day, toured the country making personal appearances from coast to coast and even christened a banana freighter.

Her Chiquita portrayal also served as the text for a church sermon, was editorialized in a national newspaper and appeared in cartoons.

Would the Puerto Rican-born Miss Miranda like to be Chiquita once more?

"I'd love to play the role again, but I'm too old," said Miss Miranda, now a vivacious 62-year-old grandmother and sales secretary for a major New York insurance brokerage.

"What they want is a bubbly

chickee." The 5-foot-2 Miss Miranda may no longer be a chickee, but she still bubbles. She can sing in five languages, speaks three fluently and is studying a couple more. She looks back on her showbiz career with fond memories.

After two years of portraying Chiquita in the mid-40s, Miss Miranda spent a dozen years in Latin America, where she sang in nightclubs and concerts in countries from Argentina to Venezuela. She married a tango singer, and they had a daughter, Amelia. Miss Miranda says one of her first words was "banana."

While on a 1956 trip to New York, Miss Miranda won an Arthur Godfrey talent scout show and appeared with him for a week. On another occasion her voice — both singing and speaking — was dubbed in Spanish for Judy Garland's in a movie starring the legendary song-and-dance star.

Although Miss Miranda was Chiquita personified, there were others who played the role for a while, including singers Monica Lewis and June Valli, and actress

Barbara Carrera.

The music and words to the "Chiquita" song were written by two advertising agency employees, who rattled paper clips in a drinking cup to simulate maracas while composing the piece. A nearby secretary was recruited on the spot to sing the tune at an impromptu rehearsal.

Several years later, when she sang with the Boston Pops, Miss Miranda says, "the audience loved it, and I had to do an encore. The musical director, Arthur Fiedler, did a whole thing on commercials, and I was the only one to appear live.

"I love bananas — but Mr. Fiedler said he didn't like bananas and preferred martinis."

Miss Miranda finally left show business, returning to a secretarial job, when she decided her daughter needed more than a part-time mother. "I spent too much time on the road," she explained, "and I felt it was more important for my daughter to have a full-time mother than for me to have a career."

"There were moments when I missed the applause, the adulation and the excitement of it," she replies. "But I went right back to typing, and I didn't miss it as much as people thought I would. I guess I was a little tired of the traveling and the hectic pace.

"You can't keep still, you have to constantly travel, country to country, dealing with idiosyncrasies of each country. It's not easy. I did it for about 13 years, and that was enough.

"Sure, I missed the glamour, but nothing that really upset me."
