 rule is not fairSuppose you wanted to pass a new law that would cause
an increase in the number of students dropping out of Texas' public schools before graduation? What kind of
law would you propose? How about one preventing students from participating in the school activities they like most? Don't you think that would do the trick?
Now, members of the Texas Legislature who supported the school reform package passed earlier this month and proposed the package would vehemently deny doing proposed the package would vehemently dery doing tould cause more kids to drop out of
school. But one part of the reform package they approved will do exactly that. It is the requirement that participate in any extracurricular activities.
While the requirement could have some impact on such activities as band, choir and UIL literary competition, it
is likely to hit hardest in the area of athletics. While the Legislature was discussing the reform has won so many state championships we've lost track of the number, spoke out against the proposal. He told a
legislative subcommittee that the rule would discriminate against youngsters with poor educational backgrounds and home environments that do not
emphasize the importance of good grades. Moreover, he maintained that extracurricular activities contribute to academic excellence rather than detract. pointing out
that in Brownwood almost all the students who make the honor roll participate in some form of extracurricular activities.
Lest you dismiss this as the groundless fears of a coach
who is afraid he'll lose a star athlete to the books. Coach Wood is not one to ask special favors for his athletes. In
fact, he has a reputation as absolutely demanding that his athletes perform to their maximum ability in the classroom as well as on the football field.
He made some good points in his presentation, but they
were ignored and the rule was approved as part of the reform package.
The ultimate result is that some students who do not have the highest of academic abilities, whose main
interests lie in athletics, will lose all interest and drop out of school when they are denied the right to participate. There are those who say these students should drop out If athletics is their main motivation for attending school Those who say that, though, have most likely forgotten
what motivated them when they were teenagers. While marginal students, who might be more interested in extracurricular activities than academics, may not learn as much as the professional educators would like, if they
remain in school, attend classes and try just a little, they are bound to learn something. And who knows, they just might someday have their imagination sparked by
creative teacher and go on to substantial academic achievements. Many students who do not do that great academically in high school go on to excel in college. There is another aspect that should be considered
Regardless of what kind of grades a student makes, his Regardless of what kind of grades a student makes, his
parents are helping pay for the operation of the public parents are helping pay for the operation on
schools. Their tax dollars are also helping pay for
extracurricular activities. What right. then, does anyone extracurricular activities. What right, then, does anyone
have to tell them their child can't participate in something they're paying for? extracurricular activities should be included in public
schools activities. But as long as they are the people who are paying for them have every right to demand that
