Israeli Planes Bomb Cairo's North Suburbs

By United Press International Israeli warplanes bombed Cairo's northern suburbs today, and Egyptian accounts said 70 civilian factory workers were killed and 49 wounded. Israel said the jets may have hit the plant by mistake and warned that an 850-pound bomb with a delayed fuse had been dropped in the area.

The losses were the heaviest reported by Egypt since the 1967 War. A Cairo spokesman said two U.S. made Phantom jet fighter-bombers carried out the strike, hitting a metal works factory in Abu Zabal.

In Tel Aviv, an Israeli spokesman said pilot debriefing indicated that one plane "may have dropped bombs, as a result of technical error, outside the target area" and hit non-

military objectives. The Israeli spokesman said Defense Minister Moshe Dayan had contacted the International Red Cross representative in Tel Aviv and Gen. Odd Bull, head of the U.S. truce observer mission, to inform the Egyptians that a delayed action bomb had been used.

"Among the bmbs dropped outside the target area was an 850-pound bomb timed to explode after 24 hours which should be neutralized to prevent its explosion," Dayan informed







NEW YORK (UPI)-The underlying cause of the "disastrous" market has been the administration's efforts to slow inflation through tight fiscal and monetary policies, Alexander Hamilton Institute observes. While so far "these efforts have failed to dampen inflationary fires to any great extent. Interest rates have been sky-rocketing. There will have to be concrete evidence of a drop in interst rates before the market stages a concrete rally it adds. Meanwhile, the firm recommends a policy of investing on a dollar-cost-averaging
