To Settle Disputes In Labor Problems

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Nixon asked Congress today for broad new powers - including a compulsory settlement process - to deal with labor disputes in the transportation field such as the threatened stoppage of the nation's railroads.

Declaring present laws covering labor disputes in the transportation industry are inadequate, Nixon advocated what he described as a "final offer selection" to break dead-

He asked Congress to extend the present 80-day cooling off period allowed the government for up to an additional 30 days, to permit the government to compell partial operation of struck transportation industries if needed and to impose the compulsory settlement machinery as a last resort.

She said he appeared confused. "His walk was straight but he had a slight difficulty with speech." Mrs. Green said she thought the man appeared not been drinking.

Mrs. Green showed him to the door of the house and gave instructions to find the bathroom. She then returned to her car and almost immediately she heard a loud thud from the house. She re-entered the house to find the fallen man.

At that time Yates was unconscious but still breathing. The phone in the house was disconnected.

Mrs. Green immediately placed a cool towel on Yates' head, loosened his belt and removed his shoes. She placed She dashed to her car and

drove to Skellytown City Hall where she met Jack Cornwell, Skellytown water superintendent. They rushed back Cornwell entered the house and states he felt for Yates'

belonging to Yates were found in the bedroom adjoining the bath. It is surmised the pills were prescribed medicine. Leland Gibson, proprietor of

Inside the house, Yates had removed his dentures. It is not known whether he took a pill nor whether it would have saved his life had he done so.


