Nigerian War Near Military Conclusion

By United Press International The Nigerian civil war appeared near a military climax today with the reported capture of Biafra's last remaining airstrip at Uli, Possible mass starvation, however, threatened to prolong Africa's costlest human conflict.

In its first morning newscast, South Africa Radio said Federal Nigeria was "firmly in control" of Uli airstrip. The broadcast said federal forces were "meeting only pockets of resistance." Biafra's leader fled the secessionist state.

The Federal Nigerian government in Laos claimed Sunday its troops had captured four Biafran towns, including Biafra's provisional capital of Owerri.
