



3. A stealing away. ". the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night." (I Thess. 5:2)

4. It is the blessed hope of the believer. "Looking for that blessed hope, and the glorious appearing of the great God and our Saviour Jesus Christ".

II. THE TIME OF THE RAPTURE

1. The seven messages to the seven churches describe the history of the church. We have beyond all doubt, passed through six stages of this history and are now living in the period when the church is neither hot nor cold, and the Lord is on the outside of a dead and complacent, satisfied church. The next event that follows is the opening of a door in heaven and a voice bidding us "come up hither." 2. The time is coming at

an unexpected hour. (Matt. 24:44)

III. ITS PURPOSE 1. To gather to Himself the saints of God. 2. To protect us from the time of tribulation. (Rev.

3:10) IV. ITS CONSEQUENCES 1. For believers, it will be the fulfillment of God's promises (John 14:2-3, Acts

1:10-11)

2. For the unbeliever--End of period of grace.



N.Y. Liberalizes Abortion Law

ALBANY, N.Y. (UP1)-The State Senate on a 31-26 vote passed a bill Wednesday o give New York the most liberal abortion law in the nation. The measure, passed after

five hours of sometimes emotional debate, would allow a woman and her doctor to decide the question of abortion without restrictions. The present law, 87 years old, permits abortions only when the mother's life is endangered.

The proposed new law expected to be debated in the Assembly next week. The lower chamber killed a less liberal aboriton bill last year, but observers say assemblymen now appear more receptive.

The new bill contains no residency requirements. It places no time limit on when abortions could be performed and it contains no limit on how many abortions a woman could

The liberalized measure was condemned by opponents as 'legalized murder' while backers said it would free women "from butcher abortionists who perform thousands of illegal operations in New York State every year."




