South Vietnamese Taking Over War

WASHINGTON (UPI) - President Nixon, crediting better, than expected progress in turning the war over to the Vietnamese, has announced plans to bring home another 150,000 U.S. soldiers in the next 12 months. If successful, the withdrawal would cut the total U.S. troop comitment in Vietnam to about half of what it was when Nixon look officee.

"The decision I have announced tonight," Nixon told a nationwide radio and TV audience, "means that we finally have in sight the just peace we are seeking. We can now say with confidence that pacification is succeeding. We can say with confidence that the South Vietnamese ca develop the

"We can say with confidence that all American combat forces can and will be withdrawn," he added.

Since Nixon' started the cutbacks last June, 115,000 withdrawal plans with some soldiers have been pulled out - clear risks. bringing the current troop level took office. The latest cutback generally favorable. 284,000 by May, 1971.

South Pole Slides Into Sahara Desert

WASHINGTON (UPI)-The South Pole has slid into the Sahara Desert, a geologist said Monday. It happened during the last 450 million years, he said. Prof. Rhodes W. Fairbridge of Columbia University told the annual meeting of the American Geophysical Union that he and a team of earth scientists. from 11 nations reached this conclusion after exploring the

Sahara in January. Fairbridge theorized the 40 to 60 mile thick crust of the earth slid over a fluid-like zone like iecbergs floating in the sea. He said other evidence supports the "continental drift" explanation for earth's evolution over 4.5 billion years of life.
