The spacecraft landed upright, floating on its broad, flat bottom, and recovery helicopter one reported it was 'riding comfortably."

The spacecraft landed and remained upside right, in contrast to the last two ships returning from the moon, Swimmers were deployed in the water near the bobbing capsule. It was clearly visible on television in "stable one"

At splashdown controllers and the mission control center in Houston burst into applause as they did earlier when the command ship was first sight-A closeup TV view of the

capsule showed it was charred black by the re-entry, but it appeared in excellent condition. It's conical side gleamed silver in the bright sun. An antenna was deployed,

and a light flashed on top of the spacecraft. The closeup television view came from a camera in a nearby helicopter. The three astronauts reported

their condition was OK The spacecraft appeared unusually stable in the gentle sea. It rocked only slightly back and forth, The weather was excellent for the recovery.







Watch for weeds. If you can't dig out or chemically rid lawns of dandelions, plantain and other weeds, they'll go to seed. Next year you'll be fighting bundreds that sprout. As you mow, spot spray with 2.4-D or 2,4,5-T. By Fall you'll be rid of most weeds and they won't come back.

Watch for die-back in shrubs and trees. Summer brings drought periods. Newly painted shrubs quickly show wilting. You could lose branches or

entire plants. Antiwilt sprays help stop moisture loss. They work well to prevent drying from cold winter winds, too. Be sure to give plants one-inch of water each week, more during drought
