DALLAS (UPI) - Challenger Loyd M. Bentsen Jr., took an early lead over incumbent U.S. Sen. Ralph W. Yarborough Saturday night in the Democratic primary that could reopen the old liberal -- conservative split in Texas' dominant political party.

U.S. Rep. George Bush, R-Tex., appeared to be winning.] easily in the Republican primary over Dr. Robert Morris of Dallas for the opportunity to take on the Democratic nominee in November's general election.



### Mystery Killer Threatens To Blow Up Bus

SAN FRANCISCO (UPI) -Mary Magline Sanches. Police disclosed Thursday night that the mysterious killer who calls himself "Zodiac" and claims to have slain 10 persons Elmer Don Winegeart, has theatened to bomb a school

"I hope you enjoy yourselves when I have my blast," the killer wrote in a new message sent to the San Francisco

He demanded publicity for his threat to blow up a school bus "If you don't want me to have this blast."

The killer also said he would "like to see some nice Zodiac buttons" being worn by people. The mystery killer has claimed 10 killings, and police have credited him with five during the past 18 months.

The new letter described the bomb the Zodiac planned as a "death machine" which would explode as a school bus passed over the road where it would be placed.

### Welfare Bill To Be Re-Written

United Press International WASHINGTON (UPI)

Faced with a rebellion in the Senate Finance Committee HEW Secretary Robert H Finch aagreed to rewrite the Nixon administration's welfare reform bill.

The committee complained vigorously that the administration bill would allow some poor people to end up with a greted income if they did notaa aa w than if they did.

The committee met privately with Finch for half an hour. then agreed to suspend hearings on the administration's \$4.4 billion "family assistance plan" for two to four weeks while Finch and his aides rewrite the legislation. -

The committee instructed the Health, Educaation and Welfare secretary to come back with a "consolidated" bill revamping not only the nation's massive welfare system but the food stamp and public housing programs along with others designed to help the poor.

Sen. John J. Williams, R-Del. complained that when all the benefits under all those programs are combined, a poor family makes more from the government by not working than it could earn by working and paying taxes.

Credit the Weathermen and their brethren with one thing. They have prodded state legislatures and the Congress into the realization that in much of the country all you eed to buy dynamite is money And not much of that.

The Weathermen are a violence-prone, lately underground, wing of the revolutionary Students for a Democratic Society. They, and activists of their ilk, have been blamed for the "bomb factory" explosions and dynamite cache discoveries in New York, Chicago and other major cities this year.

It would be difficult to find a legislator willing to say a good word for the Weathermen or their ilk.

But the blasts attributed to them and others have scared many legislators into preparing a cloudburst of bills intended to impose some kind of control on who can walk into a hardware store and buy enough dynamite to blow a building sky high, Take Hard Look
