NEW YORK (UPI)-With the stock market's gains of the last six and a half years now erased, the International Statistical Bureau says, the market is now "in an excellent position" to reverse direction and begin reflecting the ecoomic upturn "indicated" for later this year. The current bear market reflects "the 1970 pause" in the economy and has yet to reflect "the more favorable outlook" for this decade, the company says.

The skimpy news on hand is hardly enough to fuel a sustained rally, according to the Alexander Hamilton Institute. But as depressing as the market Is, investors shouldn't is "obvious" that prices till turn up, the analyst adds. A few years from now present stock prices "will no doubt appear to be unbelievable bargains," the institute says.

The stock market currently is "on the defensive" with too many factors weighing against commitment in the stock market, Standard and Poors Corporation says. The list may be nearing "a bottoming area" but long-term investors would be wise to hold off a bit longer, the company says. It adds: · Once the market has truly stabilized there should be ample opportunity for reinvestment in a calmer atmosphere.
