



WASHINGTON (UPI) Americans woluntarily gave \$17.6 billion last year to support churches, schools, hospitals, museums, symphony orchetras, charitable agencies and other philanthropic causes.

That is nearly twice as much as they gave for these purposes n 1960.

Any American who is tempted to take pride in those figuers inould remember another one as well: Even at the record level attained last year, U.S. philarthropy represented only a little more than 2 per cent of total national income.

Assoication Study A study by the American Association of Fund-Raising Counsel shows that \$13.6 billion, or 77 per cent, of last year's gifts came from living indivi-

duals. Bequests by i dividuals totalled about \$1.5 billion. Include i was one whopping bequest of \$500 million by the late Ailsa Mellon Bruce to a foundation named for her father, Andrew W. Mellon.

Nearly 24,000 ; ivate foundations made grants totalling \$1.6 billion. The three largest foundations, both in terms of total assets and annual giving, are the Ford F undation, the Rockefeller Foundation and the Duke Endowment

Giving by corporations showed the smallest increase of any category. It totaled about \$300 million, or slightly less than 1 per cent of pretax corporate profits.

Significant Shifts The AAFRC study shows that significant shifts have taken place over the past decade in the way American givers divide

their largesse. At the start of the 1960's, religious institutions were the beneficiaries of 51 per cent of all philanthropic gifts. By the end of the decade, religion's share had declined to 46 per

Voluntary welfare agencies, such as those supported by Community Chest drives, also suffered a slump in public favor. They received 12 per cent of the philanthropic dollar in 1960, but only 7 per cent 1969.

Bigger slices of the philanthropic pie went to givic and cultural organizations (up from 2 to nearly 5 per cent); educational institutions (up 1.5 points to 16.5 per cent), and hospitals and other health facilities (up a fraction to 16 per cent of the total).

Negroes. The statement was Rafer Johnson's. It was spoken without bitterness.

Johnson is the spectacularly muscled decathlon champion of the 1960 Olympic Games who turned sportscaster and actor after leaving UCLA.

During vacations and between semesters, Johnson -like many another athlete at UCLA and USC --- worked as an extra and in bit parts for sports nuts among producers and execu-

tives at the studios. The practice placed Rafer on the brink of losing his amateur

"Early in 1960 I was offered a very big part in Spartacus with Kirk Douglas." Rafer recounted, "But the AAU (Amateur Athletic Union) told me I would lose my amateur standing and become a professional, eliminating me from competing in the Olympics."

The AAU figures a bit player is an amateur and a featured actor a professional -which will come as a blow to members of the Extras Guild.

Since college days Johnson has appeared in about 20 movies, gradually finding better parts in important pictures. He recently completed "The Last Grenade" and currently is working in "The Red, White and Black," a post Civil War story of the black 10th Cavalry

Quiet, Intelligent Man Johnson is a quiet, intelligent man who finds himself compet ing for roles with other black athletes in motion pictures.

Former football standouts Jim Brown, Fred Williamson, Rosie Grier, Cookie Gilchrist and the veteran Woody Strode are working increasingly often

in film's and television. Racial tensions in the United States trouble Johnson, who was a friend of the late Sen. Robert Kennedy. Rafer sees no. quick solutions to black-white differences.

Southeast Texas **Census Shows** Texas' Only Gain

By United Press International The 22-county area of Southeast Texas that falls under the Lufkin Census Bureau reported its preliminary population count Monday and for the first time ince the count began it showed Texas has gained in population over the last 10 years.

The Lufkin District reported a total increase of 55,250 persons. The combined totals from the Amarillo, Lubbock, Waco, and Longview regions totaled to a decline in population in the neighborhood of 21,000 persons.

Montgomery County provided for nearly half of the increase with a report of 20,111 more persons this year than in 1960. The other counties in the Lufkin region which reported increases were Anderson, Angelina, Brazos, Walker, Hardin, Henderson, Jasper, Madison, Nacogdoches, Newton San Jacinto and Tyler. Showing decreases were the counties of Cherokee, Liberty, Houston, Grimes, Leon, Polk,

Sabine, San Augustine and Trin-

These latest results brought to 102 the number of Texas counties reporting. No reports are in from the state's large cities which are expected to give the state its largest increases. The total population from these 102 counties gave the state a population of 2,234,374 this year as compared to 2,199,788 in 1960, an overall increase of 34,586. As expected, all the major cities in the region showed increases confirming the rural-tourban population shift evident in the last several populations

counts. The final county-by-county population change in the Lufkin district was:

Anderson, up 466; Angelina, up 9.339; Brazos, up 11,184; Cherokee, down 2,079; Liberty, down 1,030; Houston down 2,066; Walker up 3,410; Grimes, down 1,358; Hardin, up 3,989; Henderson, up 3,917; Montgomery, up 20,111; Jasper, up 2,112; Leon, down 1,749; Madison up 386; Nacogdoches, up 7,647; Polk, down 397; Newton, up 163; Sabine, down 482; San Augustine, down 85; San Jacinto, up 43; Trinity, down 310; and Tyler, up

Montgomery County's increase made it the most populous of the 22 county region. In the 1960 census, Nacogdoches County claimed that honor.

Bryan remained the largest city in the district with a population of 32,489 this year as compared to 27,542 in 1960. However, Nacogdoches made the greatest gain in population population from 12,674 in 1960 to 22,316 this year. It ranks third behind Lufkin in the district with a current population of 23,739. The district's fourth largest city is Huntsville and Palestine is fifth.




