Sunday Night Assault SAIGON (UPI) - Guerrilla troops firing rocket gren-

ades and automatic weapons attacked a U.S. position inside Cambodia, killing five Americans and wounding eight, military spokesmen said today. The attack at dusk Sunday hit a night camp of the U.S.

1st Air Cavalry Division two and a half miles inside Cambodia and about 90 miles north-northeast of Saigon. The Communist troops pounded the camp with mortar fire before charging in a ground attack.

In a 20-minute battle, the air cavalrymen beat off the assault with the aid of artillery fire and helicopter gumships that were directed by flareships. Communist losses were unknown.


