By United Press International A pair of two-plane mid-air collisions, 430 miles apart, killed nine persons Sunday in the Pacific Northwest.

At Missoula, Mont., pilots of two single-engine planes and three members of a sky diving group died when a Cessna 180 collided with a two-passenger

At Seattle, Wash., two singleengine planes collided while preparing to land and four persons perished.

A sky diver who jumped during the Missoula mishap parachuted to safety. He is James Leadbetter, 41, a Great Falls grocery manager.





This proposed amendment would take the place of the present Section I-d, Article VII. on taxation of agricultural land. The bacis lead would be the same, to give tax relief to farmers and ranchers. It would restrict the basis of tax assessment to the ability of the land to produce trees, crops, and cattle, and ignore the land's market value. It would take out of the constitution the rules for deciding what land is eligible for this tax benefit and give to the Legislature the power to make up new rules. It would also take out of the constitution restriction limiting the special tax assessment to land in actual agricultural use by individuals who are full-time ranchers and farmers, thereby giving the special tax benefit to corpérations and part-time ranchers and farmers as well.

FOR: Farmers and ranchers ugently need tax relief. Ad valorem (land) taxes have become so high that many farmers and ranchers are barely making a living. Agricultural land should not be taxed at the same rate as residential or industrial land,




