To Crush Impending Uprisings

OTTAWA (UPI)-Prime Mi nister Pierre Elliott Trudeau invoked the War Emergencies Act today to crush threatened "insurrection" by separatist terrorists.

The unprecedented peacetime action enabled thousands of police and combat - garbed troops to sweep through Quebec arresitng suspects. More than 150 suspected terrorists were arrested within hours after

Trudeau gave the go-ahead. The War E.ergencies Act, invoked only twice beforenever in peacetime-suspends civil liberties and permits police to make arrests. searches and seizures without warrant, and denies citizens' rights of appeal against police action.

In Montreal, Quebec provincial police said 99 persons were arrested in the early dawn hours. Fifty warrants were issued.

Among those reported under arrest were Robert Lemieux, Communist party of the U.S.A., Liberation du Quebec (FLQ) rally today to protest her Trudeau's two-and-a-half-year administration.

In Quebec City, 55 persons were arrested and 60 warrants



too. Wherever highways are built there must be bridge builders, too, and this is a part of our responsibility as Christians. Certain chasms must be spanned before the highway becomes useful. For a moment lets examine some of the chasms that must be spanned. The first one is one that

we don't like to be reminded of, our own selfishness. A bridge of selflessness must be built across this chasm before our lives can become useful lives and helpful to our fellow man. As long as "self" is in the way we cannot even see the needs of those around us. Our life becomes one of continual "self-satisfying". It has been said that the underlying cause of all sin is selfishness and that isn't a hard statement to un-

derstand. But there are other bridges and one is the bridge that spans the gulf between man and man. How much need there is of healing in man's relationship with his fellow man. Not just wars between nations come out of this lack but unconcern for and sometimes animosity between men is the result. Christianity has the stuff this bridge is built of. Christ was terribly concerned about the relationships of men and taught compassion and love but he couldn't build a bridge for all time. It is our responsibility to build this bridge over and over again. Another very important bridge that spans a very dangerous chasth is the one

that spans the gulf between God and man. This is a God and man. This is a chasm created by erosion. There is no chasm and then, without man realizing it, suddenly it is there, and if
