Majority Cast Vote

Pampa's long-time dream of a civic auditorium came true shortly after 7 p.m. Saturday.

The announcement came at 7:10 p.m. when election judges turned in the final count to City Secretary Stanley M. Chittenden revealing that the \$800,000 auditorium bond issue had carried 1,451 to 93.

Less than 100 persons voted against the issue with the vast majority of Pampans casting their ballots as a tribute to the memory of the late M. K. Brown whose philanthropic contribution will make the \$\$1,200,000 project possible:

The turnout was unusually heavy for a one-issue decision which was expected to be received favorably even before the City Hall voting place opened at 7 a.m. Saturday.

An almost continuous line of electors passed through the voting place all day long. Of the 1,544 total vote, 1,444 oallots were cast by property owners and only 100 by nonproperty owners.


