

Man often has trouble getting along with his fellow man. We do things that hurt each other. Whether our actions are intentional or not, we do damage to each other.

"Go, and sin no more, "He told her.

God is willing to forgive our sins just as Jesus forgave those of the lady. Can't we forgive one another? Let us forgive and forget in love as Jesus did. Then, let us go and do our best to sin no more.
