## Independents ask for injunction against action by RRC

AUSTIN - Independent oil operators are seeking an injunction against a Texas Railroad Commission order which threatens to shut down 271 "white oil" wells in the Panhandle Field. Wells Lloyd Broussard, an Austin lawyer for white oil operators, said the operators had asked 250th State operators, said the operators had asked 250th State District Judge Harley Clark for a permanet District Judge Harley Clark for a permanent injunction to keep the wells operating, and Clark had set a hearing for $9: 30 \mathrm{a} \mathrm{m}$. Oct. 7 . In a letter Sept. 13 announcing his decision in a suit filed by 14 operators and interest owners against an filed by 14 operators and interest owners against an earlier commission order, Judge Clark said, "I see no need at this time to issue an injunction" "as the white oil operators had requested. "They white oil operators had requested. "They " may request a hearing on the subject if they desire., request a hearing on the subject if they desire." Broussard said the operators had exercised that option, and also hoped to get Clark to sign a final judgment in the case Oct. judgment in the case Oct. 7. Growth protein may open new doors in cancer fight

| BOSPON detailed (AP) organ-forming protein, a natural chemical that induces the body to sprout blood vessels, could open heart disease and other ailments, researchers say <br> The protein, named angiogenin, was discovered and studied by researchers at Harvard Medical School, who published their findings in the latest issue of the journal Biochemistry. They also isolated the gene that oversees production of the protein <br> It is the first time that a specific substance has been clearly related to the creation of a type of organ," Biochemistry. "That is really a first. <br> Cancers secrete angiogenin and probably other, similar, substances - to promote the growth of tiny blood vessels called capillaries. This provides the blood supply that allows the tumor enlarge and eventually spread. enlarge and eventually spread. Some experts theorize that some way could be found to block angiogenin and its chemical cousins, then cancers could be topped <br> "I would fondly hope that this will prove possible," said Dr. Bert L . Vallee, who directed the research. "I think this should facilitate it." facilitate it. | Experts say the work represents a major step in the study of angiogenesis, or blood vessel formation, which was pioneered two decades ago by Dr. Judah Folkman, another Harvard researcher <br> It's a stunning achievement Folkman said. "I think it's very important for the whole field, because it will enlarge everyone's thinking about how tumors send the signal to keep blood vessels growing in toward them <br> Dr. James F. Riordan, another member of the research team, said one logical cancer strategy will be to try to produce antibodies that <br> The researchers said they were surprised to find that angiogenin holds about a 35 percent similarity called ribonuclease This to could be turned to their advantage in finding ways to defeat the protein <br> Comparing angiogenin to it three-dimesives us a clue as to Riordan said. "If you know the structure, you can try to design drugs that will specifically bind to the protein" and deactivate it promoters also probably play role in diseases besides cancer. For instance, experts believe that they are responsible for the | proliferation of blood vessels that leads to blindness in victims of diabetes as well as the overabundance of capillaries in rheumatoid arthritis. <br> Neurath said it may be possible to use the substance to promote the growth of new blood vessels in victims of heart disease. <br> Vallee said much more work workings of the gene and the chemical it produces. <br> What turns it on?" he said What turns it off? It is enough to keep people busy a long time. <br> The scientists derived cancer and showed that it would promote capillary growth in chicken eggs and rabbits. <br> Normal tissues also produce similar hormones.
