#### Abstract

WASHINGTON - Recent debate about the and seen occurring achille American officials are justifiably upset with the detions of the Egyptian and Italian governments uspects in the case to wriggle free though the Egyptian part of the problem has been corrected. he rights and wrongs of this performance are eing disputed for the most part in diplomatic and egalistic terms - which, sad to say are very much 

As the world is by now well aware, the Palestine Liberation Oorganization (PLO). Connected released by the Egyptians, placed on an EgyptAir released by te Egyptians, placed on an EgyptAir 737 bound for Tunis, then intercepted by U.S. Navy jets and forced to ground in Sicily They are now in jets and forced to ground in Sicily. They are now in custody awaiting trial in an Italian court, as various of their suspected accomplices are being various of their suspected accomplices are being rounded up. The release and interception of the four hijackers have embittered relations between the huackers have embittered relations between the United States and Egypt - development that is a bonus for the PLO. Americans are outraged that benus for the PLO. Americans are outraged that accused of piracy and murdering a U.S. citizen. The Egyptians claim they should get credit for resolving the crisis, fuzz over the details of how resolving the crisis, fuzz over the details of how and why the hijackers were released, and complainabout the intercention In this go-round, the Italians originally came and denouncing the Egyptian release of the impressive. Very shortly, however, all this went sour, as the government of Bettino Craxi let still aour, as the government of settino Craxi let st another suspect PLO ring-leade Abul Ab bas -go free. Thereuipon. U.S. -talian relations becan free. Thereupon, U.S-Italian relations became embittered, also - another bonus for the terrorists. Though he wasn't aboard the cruise liner, there is plenty of reason to believe Abbas was acting as control for the four hijackers. According to radio intercepts released by the Israelis, Abbas advised intercepts reeseased by the israeilis, Abbas advised tell the passengers and crew "our objective was not to take control of the ship." Yet the Italians allowed him to get away scott-free, even as they were taking custody of his henchmen. Considering that Egypt and Italy are both allies of the United States, what are we to make of all this? How does it happen that first one of our allies, and then the other, permits the escape of allies, and then the other, permits the escape of people who stand accused of piracy, kidnapping people who stand accused of piracy, kidnapping and murder of a U.S. citizen? What has happened to the rules and conventions of international law that are supposed to govern the relations of

Countries in such matters? The answer, unhappily The answer, unhappily, is that international law has nothing much to do with it. The PLO and othe terrorists in the Middle East have been operating outside its rules for years, and getting opaya with it. (The Iranian hostage crisis of 1979-80, and this it. (The Iranian hostage crisis of 1979-80, and thi summer's hijacking in Beirut, are obviou examples.) They have done so by the simple expedient of making people more afraid of them than they are of any sanctions that than they are of any sanctions that might be imposed for violations In the case of Egypt, with its own interna mpose troubles including factions zealous for the PLO and other extremists, the cause of such concern is and other extremists, the cause of such concern is obvious. It was only a few years ago, it will be obvious. It was only a few years ago, it will be recalled, that Egypt's President Anwar Sadat was murdered, in retaliation for his moderate Mubarak, is well aware of that grim episode. The situation is not quite so clear in Italy, bu "recognizes" the PLO will. The Italian governmen supposed to be exempt from terrorist attacks When it appeared that the Italians might hang on to Abbas, PLO chieftian Yasser Arafat reportedly warned that "uncontrollable reactions" would result. whereupon Abbas was released result, whereupon Abbas was released, and Arafat thanked for his cooperation. Add it all up, and the message is fairly clear The affected governments are more afraid of the PLO than they are of the USA. Unless we continue PLO than they are of the USA. Unless we continue to toughen our posture in such cases, more of the same may be expected in the future.
