



Administrative jobs may need some 2,000,000 more persons in 1960 than in 1940, it was estimated; nearly 1,000,000 new teachers must be recruited and trained between 1950 and 1960 to match the growth of the population and the economy, and to overcome today's deficit; some 26,000 more doctors will be needed than the number now in sight, and the nation will need about 40,000 more dentists than were

practicing in 1940. To accomplish such goals, the commission said, it will be necessary for the federal government 'expand greatly" its financial aid. Scholarships, fellowships and "general support" were mentioned, but the commission said would offer specific proposals in later reports.
