AUSTIN -(A)- Purchasers advance nominations for Texas crude oil for January totaled 300,000 2,121 835 barrels daily, mere than current production, as the Railroad Commission held the monthly statewide oil proration hearing.

Preliminary to the hearing t determine January field allow-ables, Commission Chairman Ernest O. Thompson told reporters the national daily demand for oil is far greater than current production even though produc-tion is at an all-time high. "The big reason is that people

are converting from coal to oil heaters," Thompson said. "Over nomes have converted to oi! this year. The average home heating unit consumes 2,500 gallons per year, which is more than the average auto uses."

The Bureau of Mines estimate of demand for Texas crude for January had not reached the commission prior to the hearing, but Thompson said he expected it to be considerably above the estimate of 2,300,000 barrels daily for December. He reported Texas production
