## EDITORIAL

## Proposals Too Much

One indisputable fact has emerged from the spirited debate over the proposed new state constitution on the November 4th ballot: many of its provisions, written by the legislature, are so vague and ambiguous that they are subject to Presiding Judge John F Onion Jr. of the Court of Criminal Appeals and former Chief Justice of the Supreme Court Robert Calvert disagree strongly, for instance, on the effect of the judiciary article. Onion contends that combining the state's two top courts into one, which would handle appeals in both civil and criminal cases, would slow down the wheels of justice; Calvert says it would

Both sides do agree that the complete revision of the constitution would give vast new powers to the legisiature. It would require annual legislative sessions, permit the legislature to set its own salaries and even permit the members to call themselves into session. Proponents claim this is good and that the people should just "trust the legislature". The opponents' view seems much more need a strong constitution to protect our basic rights from a legislature which can change complexion completely every two years.
Governor Dolph Briscoe strongly opposes all eight propositions on next Tuesday's ballot. So do former Governors Allan Shivers and Preston Smith. And none of them are running for higher office. They have had some serious
differences on political matters in the past but their experiences in government differences on political matters in the past but their experiences in government
have led all three to the conclusion that the present constitution should be have led all
Comptroller Bob Bullock says the new constitution would give so much power to the legislature that it is impossible to estimate how much it would cost the taxpayers.
Some proponents argue that there are some good features in the new constitution which out-weigh the bad. But there is no urgency involved in revising the constitution and there is no reason to adopt any provisions which are known to be bad. The good features involved can be singled out in the future and adopted as individual amendments, without turning our Texas Legislature
into a fulltime "little Congress" which would exercise enormous control over our lives. We prefer to keep them as our servants, instead of making them our masters. The way to do that is to vote "no" on all eight propositions next Tuesday.
