State Auditor Enters Probe Of Dallas County Tax Office

DALLAS, Oct. 7. (AP)—State auditor C. H. Cavness was to confer here today with county officials as an investigation into the county tax office continued.

Cavness said yesterday he would decide after the conference today whether to audit the books and records of the late Dallas county tax assessor and collector, Ed Cobb.

District Attorney Will Wilson yesterday obtained a probate court order to collect from Cobb's estate \$51,809.15 which Wilson claimed is due the county.

Cobb died Thursday. He had served as Dallas county tax assessor and collector since 1934.

Wilson said a personal debt in the amount of \$51,809.15—in the form of 17 checks drawn by Cobb on his private account in the Irving State Bank—was uncovered Sunday in an audit of the cash drawer of the county tax office.

Wilson said there were sufficient funds on deposit yesterday in Cobb's account at the Irving bank to cover the drafts, which ranged in amounts from \$35 to \$7,000 each. All but two of the checks were undated and were made payable to the order of Ed Cobb, tax assessor and collector.

On Wilson's application, W. H. Reid, Dallas attorney, was appointed administrator of the estate of Cobb. Reid was ordered to present the checks to the Irving bank today for payment.

Reid said a deposit sufficient to cover the checks was made in the Irving bank shortly after it opened yesterday morning. He did not know who deposited the money.

Reid was also ordered to locate any other personal bank accounts or lock boxes in the name of Cobb

or other person holding for Cobb. The order was signed by County Judge Al Templeton sitting as probate judge.

The commissioners court of Dallas has postponed the appointment of a successor to Cobb until tomorrow "or later."

Texas Spends More Than It Takes In

AUSTIN, Oct. 7. (AP)—Texas has started a new fiscal year by spending more on its state government than it is taking in.

The comptroller reported yesterday that total expenditures for all state services during September were \$1,590,289 above total revenue receipts from all sources.

September was the first month of the fiscal year. It was the first month in which heavy appropriations by the 50th Legislature were accurately reflected in a comparative statement of income and outgo.

The comptroller also reported income for the first month of this fiscal year was still far ahead of the first month of the last fiscal year.

In 1946, September income was \$25,055,435 compared with \$32,306,591 in September 1947.

Jester Will Ride Champion Horse

PALESTINE, Oct. 7. (AP)—Gov. Beauford Jester was to ride a champion quarter horse in the Texas State Fox and Wolf Hunters Association's first annual field trial near here today.

The three-year-old stallion, Billy May, was loaned by its owner, George Calhoun of Palestine. The horse was named "Supreme Champion of the World" at the Iowa Park Texas horse show last week.

More than 400 hounds have been assembled for the field trials lasting through Thursday, B. A. Skipper of Encino said.

The United Cement, Lime and Gypsum Workers International Union (AFY) voted to end the strike last night, accepting a company offer of 10 1/2 cents an hour increase based on a 40-hour week. The offer was first made at the expiration of the old contract May 8.

J. M. Youngblood, union representative, announced settlement of the dispute at Sweetwater.

The strike had cut off the major supply of Texas wallboard.

Houston To Enforce Sunday Ordinance

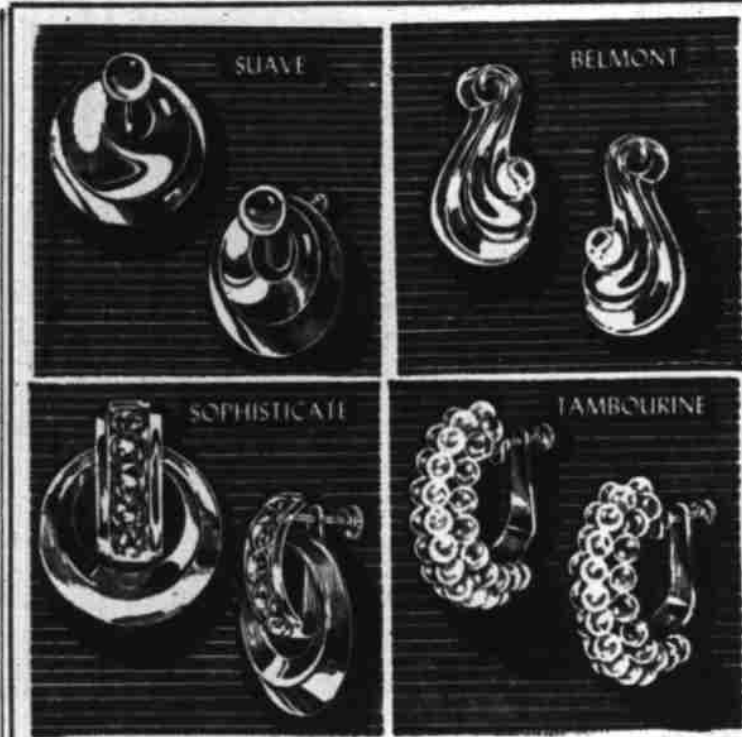

'Automatic Brain' To Fly Army Plane

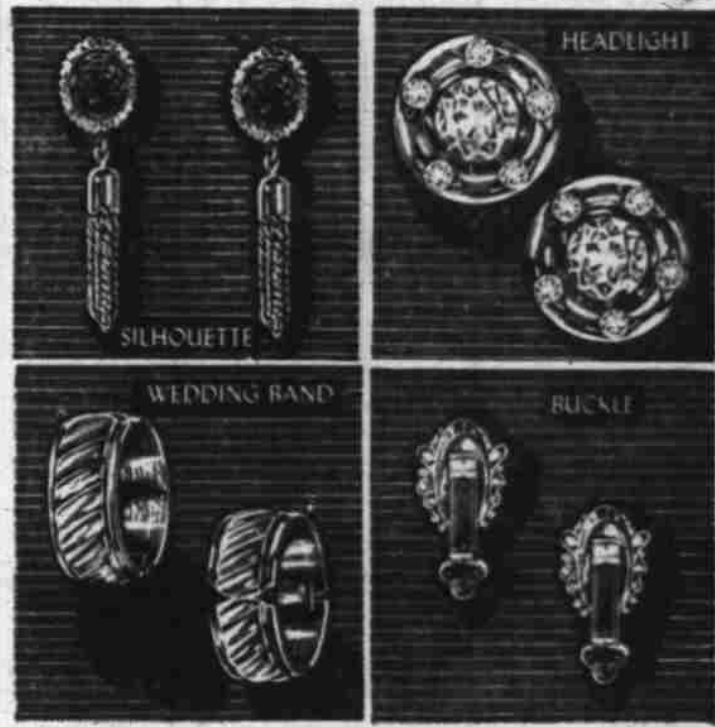

Hoffman (R-Mich.), called today for a showdown with the justice department over whether his committee has a legal right to look at the records on the parole of four former Chicago gangsters. He ordered subpoenas for Attorney Gen. Tom Clark and Daniel M. Lyons, chairman of the U. S. parole board, to appear before the House executive expenditures committee (10 a. m., E. S. T.) this morning with the papers in the case.

Williams was held in the Panola county jail last night. His bond was set at \$5,000. The shooting occurred at Williams' home, where Arnold was a temporary boarder. Williams was arrested by Deputy Sheriff G. W. McNeiss, who said Arnold was an uncle of Mrs. Williams.
