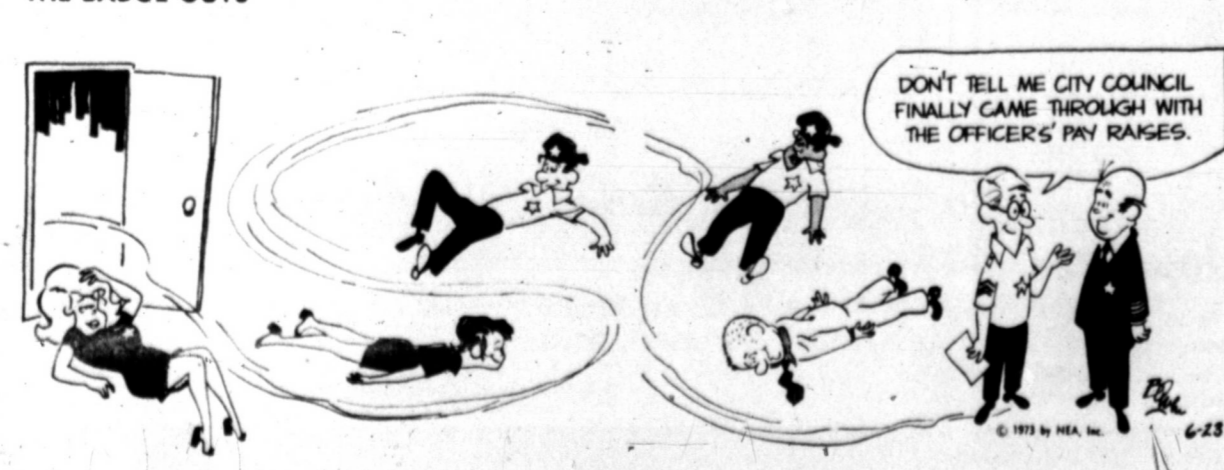

Farmers Gather In Bountiful Harvest

Tibby Rogers, her brother, drives the combine through the field to harvest the ripened wheat.

While he unloads the wheat into a waiting truck, Tom Rogers, shovels the wheat into the corners of the truck.

With the harvest getting under way, the Rogers family began to gather in the harvest with the family help.

Tom Rogers, father, drives the grain trucks to and from the grain elevators in Pampa, while Dana Rogers, the daughter, maneuvers the other truck so her brother, Tibby Rogers, can dump the grain from the combine into an empty truck.

Their combine, a new Ford, was made in West Germany. It cuts a swath 22 feet wide through the wheat and has a hopper which holds 130 bushels of threshed grain.

Tom Rogers says of the combine, "A lot of people driving by on the highway to Perryton, slow way down to look at the combine. It is the only one in this area and what

really stops em is its metallic blue color."

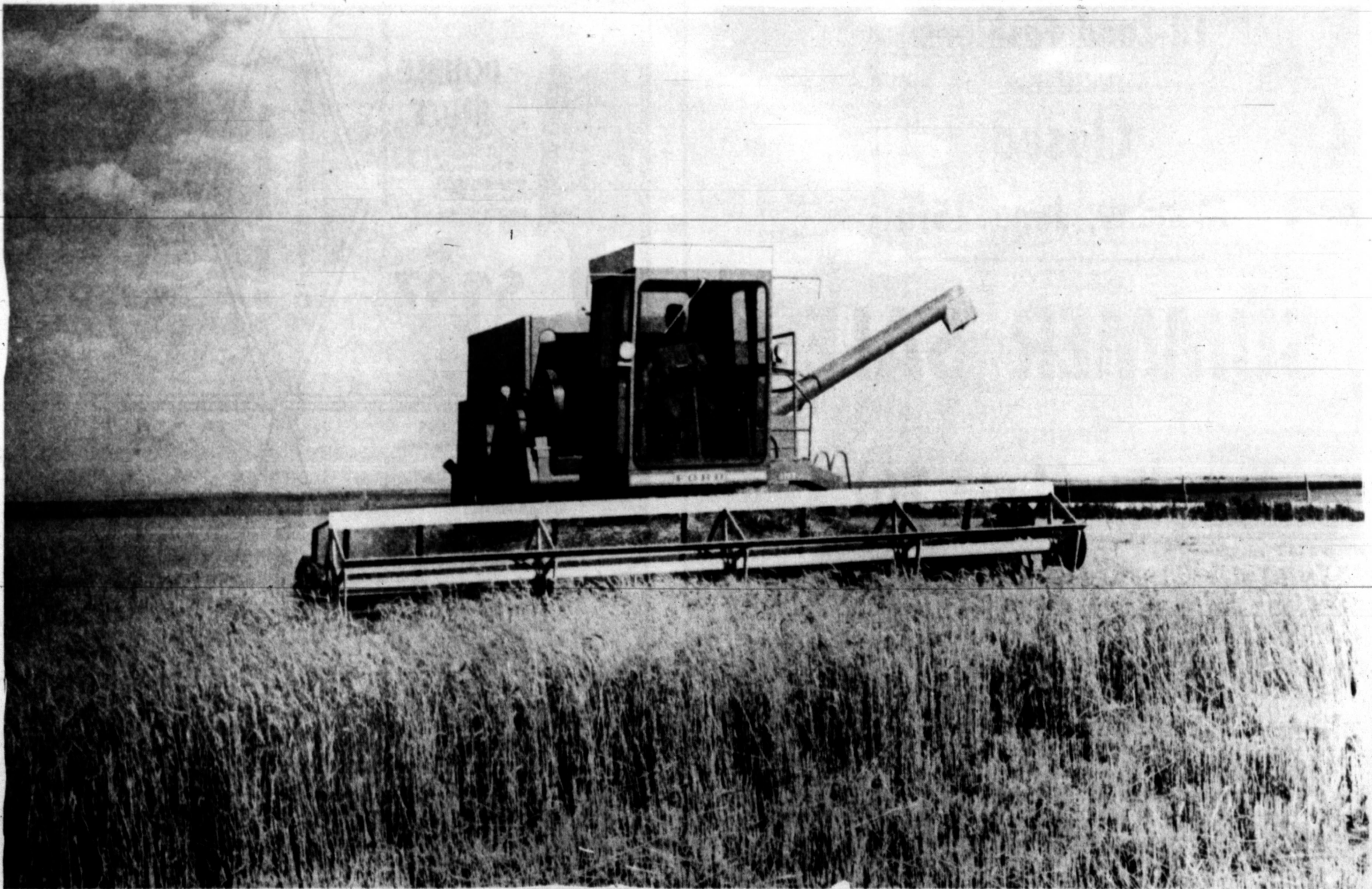
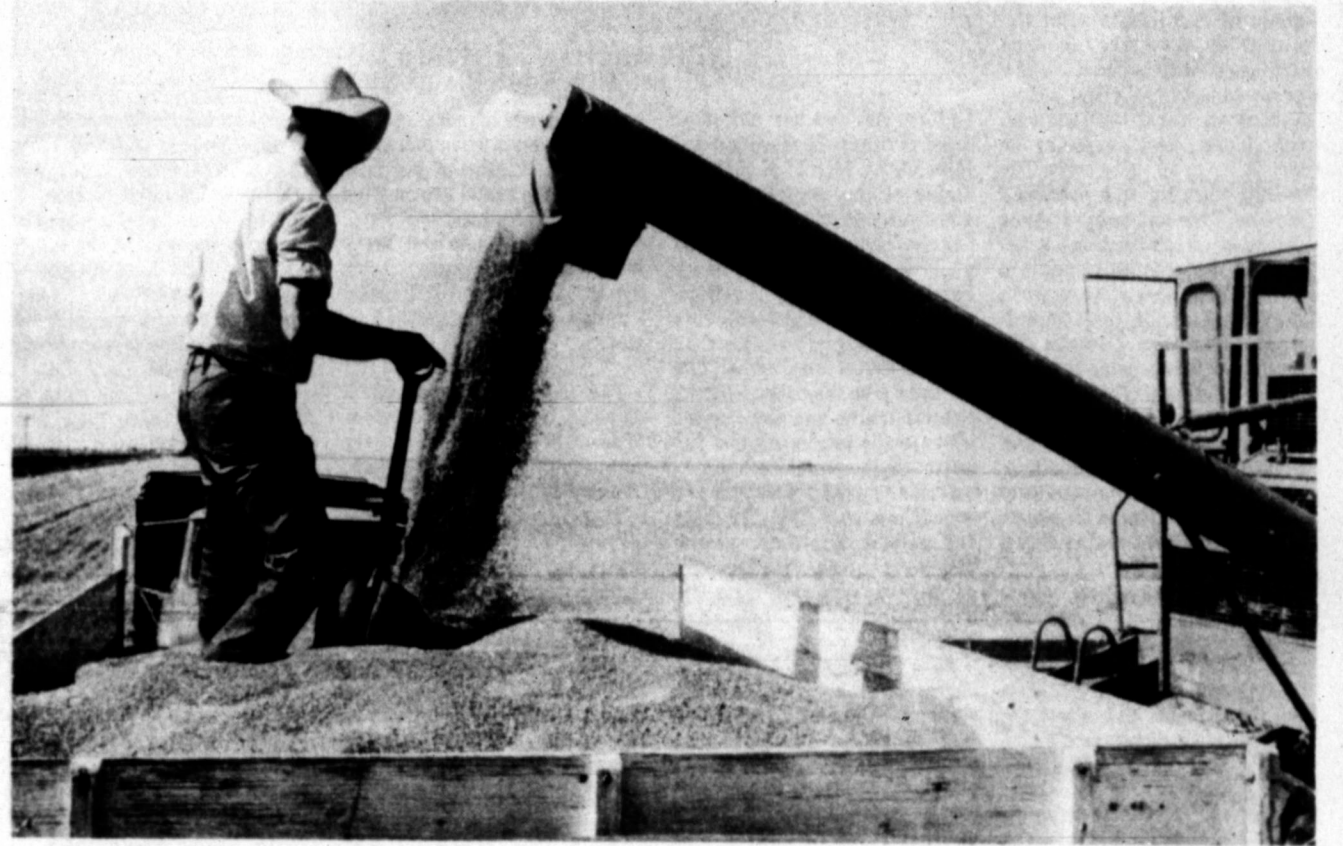
Most combines are either green or yellow with a few red or metallic aluminum.

With his truck loaded with grain, Tom Rogers drives to the Wheeler - Evans Elevator in Pampa to store the grain. Arriving there, his loaded truck is weighted and the weight is stamped on a card.

He then deposits the grain at the elevator and weighs the truck empty. The difference in weight is then figured by the official weigher at the scales and the amount of bushels is figured. Also the grain is tested for moisture content.

After receiving his receipt for the grain he then returns to the field for another load in the never - ending cycle of harvest time.

Watermelon Pickles

"It's hard to think of eating watermelon any better way than just digging in and letting the cold juice run, but we've found twelve other ways to serve this delectable melon." Agriculture Commissioner John C. White reports.

The recipes are offered in a brochure published by the Texas Department of Agriculture, available in local supermarkets or from the Department. The serving suggestions range from melon punch to watermelon pickles.

Long a favorite home-preserved treat, watermelon pickles are easy to prepare.

- 2 pounds watermelon rind
- 2 cups vinegar
- 2 cups water
- 4 cups sugar
- 1 stick cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon whole cloves
- 1 teaspoon whole allspice
- 1 lemon, sliced thin

Pare watermelon rind and remove all but a slight tinge of the red portion. Cut rind into pieces 2 x 1 inches and 1/4 inch thick or into 3/4 to 1 inch cubes. Weigh. Soak rind overnight in brine made by dissolving 1/4 cup salt in each quart water. Drain rind, wash in fresh water and drain. Cook rind in fresh water until tender. Combine remaining ingredients and boil together 5 minutes. Add rind a few pieces at a time and cook until rind is clear. Pack rind in hot sterilized jars, cover with boiling syrup and seal. Makes 2 pints. (Red or green food coloring may be added if desired.)

Making watermelon preserves is another way of utilizing the rind. Two recipes are included in the brochure.

Watermelon can be prepared in surprising and attractive ways. Recipes are included for watermelon ice, cocktail balls, fresh fruit combo, melon punch, frosty melon salad, melon sherbet, and a watermelon boat, great for parties.

For the wedding trip to Washington, D.C. the bride wore a Valentino original dress and jacket ensemble of yellow and beige.

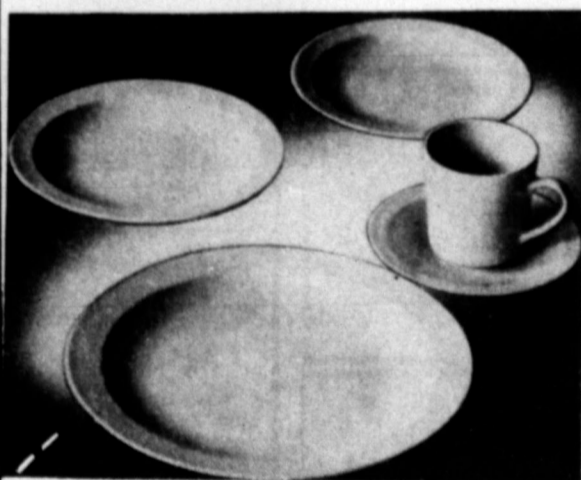

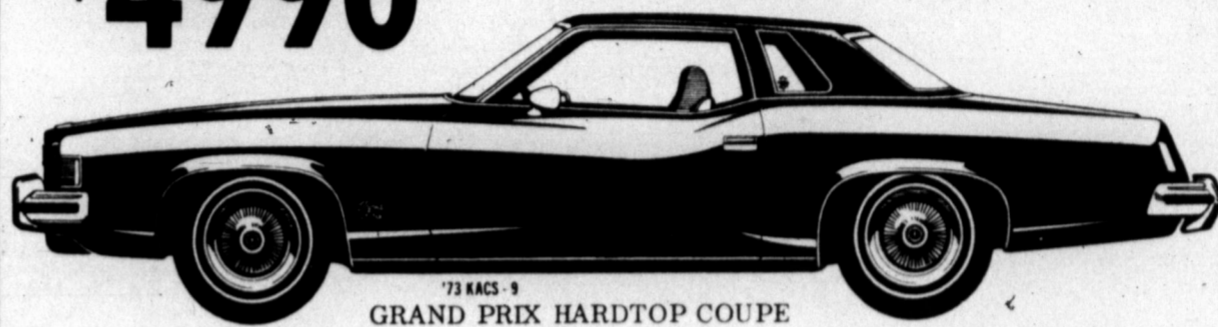

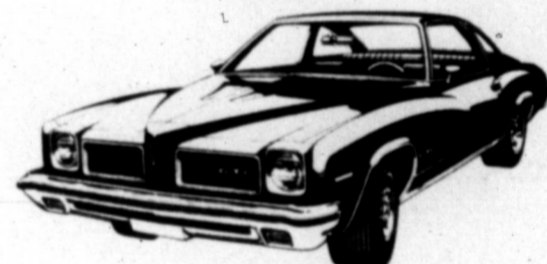
