Purchases Will Be Used In Schools, Welfare Work

WASHINGTON - UP - The government has launched a pork and lard buying venture to give a psychological boost to sagging hog prices and a political lift to Midwestern hog raisers. The pork will be used for school lunches and welfare programs.

Secretary of Agriculture Ezra T. Benson announced late Monday the government will begin buying 'as soon as practicable" about \$85 million worth of dressed pork and lard to "assist farmers in adjusting their production to market Administration political strate-



Gun Found By Ex-Pampan's Death Site

ALAMOGORDO, N. M. -UP-A .45-caliber automatic pistol found not far from the spot where a middle - aged coin machine concern owner was found murdered furnished authorities Monday with their "biggest break" yet in solving the slaying.

The recovery of the pistol and discovery of a pair of blood-stained gloves caused Otero County Sheriff Carl Hansen to predict the gunshot death of M. M. Rutherford, 52, might be cleared up within 24 hours.

Rutherford was killed Friday afternoon as he sat in his car parked along a state highway eight miles east of Cloudcroft, N. M. Doctors performing an autopsy recovered five .45 caliber bullets from the Alamogordo businessman's body.

Hansen said the pistol was located along the righway three and one-half miles east of the place where Rutherford's car was parked. The gloves were picked up another mile and a half east of the spot where the pistol was found. Hansen believed the fleeing killer threw them out the window of his car as he raced east along the road from the murder scene. Rutherford, who had moved here

"A year or two ago there was published a book called 'The Twenty-Fifth Hour.' Not 'The Eleventh Hour,' not 'The Twenty - Third Hour' — but 'The Twenty - Fifth Hour.' The book was a novel with a purpose. Its purpose was to show that the real battle of today was not so much the battle against Communism as the battle of the individual against the State. Of that battle the struggle against Communism was indeed one aspect most strikingly dramatized. But in capitalist as well as in Communist societies, the State has acquired powers so vast that, by comparison with them, the individual has been reduced to complete subordination and helpless.

Battle Of The Individual"

"In the author's view the battle of the individual against the State was a lost battle so far as Europe was concerned. It was 'The Twenty - Fifth Hour:' and the gong had sounded. But to this generalisation the writer made one exception - Great Britain. There, he thought, we were still on the right side, but only just on the right side, of the Twenty - Fourth Hour.' There, granted the character and history of the British people, there might come a revulsion which would prevent the 'Twenty - Fifth Hour' ever being reached. What hope is there of

"If there is to be any hope, we must remind ourselves how far young do not realize this, for they have never experienced freedom. An ancient writer once wrote -'The old do not long outlive the there arises a generation which has never known it.' By what process have we lost so much liberty that the survival of what is left

"The process has been gradual and insidious. It has been accomplished in the main as the result of looking to the State for the solution of all human problems. If wages were low, for instance, let the State impose Minimum Wage Acts. If there was unemployment, let the State provide 'Work or Maintenance.' If there was sickness, let the State provide Sickness Benefit. If there was old age, let the State make provision for

itself, produces nothing. Whatever it appeared to 'give' to the eitizen in one form, it had first to take from him in another.

"The second is that whenever the State 'gives' an apparent benefit, it takes away a real liberty. "Thus the strict corollary of

making the State responsible for Unemployment is the compulsory direction of labour. This is at first exercised with as little obvious compulsion and as much persuasion as possible. But the threat of 'no benefit' is behind the persuasion. In Communist countries, (that is, countries in which all pretence that the State is not sovereign in every field, has been completely dropped) men go where they are told - or else! And the 'else' is not the mere withholding of benefit, but the concentration camp, the salt-mines, prison, and even death. The corollary of making the State responsible for Sickness Benefit is the National Health Service - which works well, only because something of the mental attitudes of the old Family Doctor still survives. 

Reciamation costs, the committee said, are "being diligently repaid' by water users, and by power revenues. The committee also cited increased tax evenue from reclaimed land.


