Rebel Who Dares

Parents, particularly those with children in school, are given a warning against the "11th Commandment" of today's society by a leading Baltimore psychoanalyst, Dr Lindner. What is the commandment?

"You must adjust."

Dr. Linder is one of the few psychoanalysts who has the courage to speak out against the trend of public school training when he declared that today's emphasison "social adjustment" to be a "monstrous falsehood."

Adjustment, as we have come to learn is just another name for conformity, and if the pressure on children to conform, adjust and be happy little peas in a pod continues, Dr. Lindner points out, a good many "very well may end up as one-headed monsters in a space museum."

Today the principal concern of the teacher with the student is that Willy conform, "get along well" with others and be happy in the activities of "the group." And if the wayward child prefers to be a lone wolf, or seek companionship of only a few or go against "the norm" the parents will soon hear about it and understand that this is a terrible thing.

Such children, it is often suggested, need psychiatric "help."

But, as Dr. Lindner points out, by the time such a child has reached college age he has undergone so much pressure for adjustment that the mold which squeezes him is no longer troublesome and he enjoys his "fitting in."

So concerned is Dr. Lindner that he feels there are many children actually building up mental diseases through excessive pressure to conform to the mold.

The child that does not conform, he added, is rarely popular, in school or elsewhere. Like the non-conforming adult, he upsets the status quo that that disturbs those who are glorying in the status guo and the hold that it gives over the lives of others.

Labor unions will admit that they are absolutely helpless to increase the wages of their own members unless they can prevent individual workers from having the right to make their own contract. In other words, they admit they cannot suc-

cessfully rob society" without a monopoly. The laws that they have been successful in getting passed in the last half century that do great harm to our country are the Clayton Amendment to the Sherman Anti-Trust Law, the Norris-La-guardia Law, the Wagner Law, the Taft-Hartley Law, the Minimum

Wage Law, the time-and-a-half law for over 40 hours, and the interpretation of these laws that prevents the employer from showing preference in hiring and retaining help to men who are individually responsible.

Under these collectivistlaws the employer has a perfect right to show preference for members of labor unions that are not individually responsible, but he has no right to show preference for responsible citizens. And these are the laws and interpretations which

The Doctor Says

A considerable number of diseases, both common and unusual -and serious and not so serious -are now known to be caused by viruses.

A virus is a living organism too small to be seen under the ordinary microscope, varying in size and its power to cause disease

In addition to the diseases known to be caused by a virus, there are a number of disorders which are believed to be virus generated but in which the particular virus responsible has not yet been defintiely identified.

AMONG THE KNOWN viral diseases are such varied human disorders as influenza, polio, measles, warts, cold sores, infectious and serum hepatitis, chicken pox, shingles, cat scratch disease, psittacosis (parrot fever), smallpox, rabies, (hydrophobia) and in all probability some of the "common colds." This is by no means a complete list but serves to give an idea of the problems faced by research workers in attempting to control disease caused by viruses. Smallpox was doubtless the best known and most studied of viral diseases until recently. A terrific killer of the past, this disease has been brought under control by means of vaccination which brings about a reasonably lasting immunity.

Treatment, even with modern drugs and methods, is relatively useless once smallpox has develo-ed. It is still a hazard because of the unvaccinated members of society; in 1950 a single American hospital in Korea reported 21 cases with 8 deaths. ALTHOUGH POLIO is a wide-

Efforts to produce a vaccine against influenza and some varieties of "colds" have been extensive and some research workers are . confident that success is not far off if not already attained.
