### **New MISD phone numbers**

Muleshoe Independent School District will be changing to a new phone system at the beginning of the new year.

The schools are working with Five Area Phone Company rearranging phone lines to allow transferring between campuses. In order for intercampus transferring, new phone numbers must be assigned to the entire school district.

Back in September, the district set up a line so that parents and students can call to find out about early dismissals, if school will start later or to see what days students will be off due to inclement weather. The number to call is 272-SNOW.

# Four Mule defenders earn state honors

Week after week, opposing coaches heaped praise on Muleshoe's rock-solid and rugged

Led by Matt Turney, four senior members of the Mules' defensive unit gained more recognition this week by earning honorable mention on the 1998 Associated Press' Sports Editors' Class 3A all-state team.

Colorado City punter Randy Byington was the only player from the South Plains on the first or

Turney, a 6-4, 280-pound senior, was selected as both an offensive and defensive lineman.

Cleavinger (6-6, 215), senior linebacker Greg Pena (5-10, 210) and senior defensive back B.J. Gonzales (5-7, 165).

"Those kids deserve it." Muleshoe head football coach David

Wood said. "I thought we were well represented. I think it says a lot for the program."

The four seniors were key contributors on a defense that posted six shutouts and helped Muleshoe earn its first playoff berth since 1983. The Mules (10-2) won the District 2-3A title and advanced to the area round before being eliminated by Crane.

Holmes invites the community members, especially kids, to come take a look at his displays, which include a five-foot tall Santa that moves on his front porch and a ferris wheel and carousel. He said his next project was to make the carousel strong enough for the smaller children to ride.



# Food pantry bridges gap for area's needy

The idea of starting a food pantry to help out needy families in the Muleshoe area and surrounding communities started in February.

Kay Graves, one of the cochairmen of the pantry said that before jumping into the project, the board members of the Bailey County Ministerial Alliance talked to several communities involved in similar projects about starting a food pantry.

Blankets and clothing, according to Graves, were already supplied by the Thrift Store, and there was a great need for food.

"There are so many elderly and low income families doing without proper nutrition," Graves said.

The pantry, which opened in September, uses state guidelines to determine what families are in greatest need. They also ask the families for Social Security verification and utility bill verification to make sure they are a legal resident living in the surrounding area.

More than 90 families in Muleshoe are receiving food from the pantry, most of them senior citizens.

Graves said many senior citizens have expensive medicines and cannot always afford a nutritious meal. "It's like their

choice is 'do I eat this month or buy medicine'," Graves said. Other recipients are working, but only making minimum wage, which is not enough to support a couple with several children. They may also be on food stamps, but the pantry can help "bridge the gap between the food they might already be getting."

Nearly a dozen community. members have volunteered generous amounts of time collecting food and organizing the pantry, located in the Episcopal Church on American Boulevard. Most volunteers are BCMA board members. The

# **Board** okays new home

A new nursing home in Muleshoe is one step closer to becoming a reality.

The Muleshoe Area Hospital District officially voted Thursday to proceed with its plans to build a \$2.5 million facility on donated land in the new city park.

Hospital board members and officials have been discussing the feasibility of building a replacement facility for the current nursing home for more than a year.

Board members cited overwhelming community support and demand for a bigger nursing home as the main reasons for approving the project.

"The best I can tell, the community is for it," said board president Buck Campbell. "There are a lot of people in Muleshoe that have expressed aneed for a new nursing home."

Primilinary plans call for a 80-90 bed facility that would include a separate Alzheimers unit. The city has agreed to donate land on the south side of the park for the project.

Hospital admisintrator Jim Bone hopes the district can break ground early this summer and complete the project by the following August.

According to revenue projections, the nursing home will break even at 80 percent capacity. The current 54-bed home has run at close to 100 percent capacity for the last decade.

The district plans to finance the project through private investors and believes the loan can be paid off in 20 years or

Members of a community nursing home committee spent the past few months visiting nursing homes in the area. They told the board it was important that the facility had a "homelike" atmosphere and was built with casual comfort in mind.

## Texans could see auto insurance rates drop

AUSTIN—Texas Insurance Commissioner Elton Bomer last week ordered cuts averaging 5.5 percent to the private-passenger auto insurance benchmark rate.

The cuts are to take effect Feb. 15.

Drivers carrying only liability insurance also will see cuts averaging 7.8 percent, Bomer said.

Bomer's action follows a 5 percent benchmark rate cut he ordered last January. At the time, he urged companies to file lower rates. Major companies in the personal auto insurance market responded by reducing rates 7 percent on average.

Insurance company claim payouts continue to lag behind premium collections because of tort reform, safer cars, less drunken driving and other factors, Bomer said.

"We need to close this gap so that consumers don't pay too much for their car insurance. All the evidence justifies a substantial rate reduction that still should leave the companies a fair profit on their Texas business," he said.

The rate changes apply only to drivers insured by rate-regulated insurance companies that cover about 75 percent of the drivers in Texas.

Bomer did not order changes to rates for commercial auto

insurance, following a recommendation by administrative law judges.

Minorities, poor pay more

Where a driver lives may have a bearing on how much he must pay to get behind the wheel with suitable insurance coverage in Texas, a new study shows.

State Rep. Lon Burnam, D-Fort Worth, last week told the Austin American-Statesman that data collected in the first quarter of 1998 by the House Insurance Committee show that "many lower-cost, standard insurers appear to systematically deny coverage to consumers who live in poor and minority areas."

Only 49.7 percent of drivers are insured by less-costly, rateregulated lines of insurance if they live in areas where the minority population is 85 percent or greater.

In 1997, rate-regulated premiums in Texas averaged \$800 a year, while non-regulated premiums averaged \$1,300 a year, the study said.

Welfare rolls have shrunk

A study released last week by the Texas Department of Human services gives a first look at the impact of the 1995 welfare reform law.

More than two-thirds of adults pushed off welfare rolls found work; those workers were paid an average of \$6.28 an hour; and most of them found jobs in the food service, clerical, retail sales or healthcare fields, the study shows.

The average annual salary of the respondents was slightly more than \$11,000. The figure the federal government use to mark the poverty level for a family of three is \$13,650.

Since 1994, state welfare rolls have dropped by nearly 400,000 recipients, and over the same period, food stamp rolls have dropped by 1.3 million recipients, the study said.

Work requirements and time limits on Texas welfare benefits took effect in 1996. Work or job training is mandated for most people between ages 18 and 59.

Scholarship hike proposed

State Rep. Henry Cuellar, D-Laredo, last week filed legislation that would give Texas high school students access to \$250 million more in financial aid for college.

Student loan and grant programs presently total about \$156 million.

Under Cuellar's proposal, an applicant's family's annual income would have to total less than \$75,000, among other cri-

Teacher reward plan proposed

Education Commissioner Mike Moses, in response to a legislative directive, last week announced a teacher pay-forperformance program that will reward teachers for gains in

student performance.

Every year, cash awards of \$750 per person would go to 25 percent of state's educators, under the commissioner's pro-

Rewards would go to all teachers at campuses that have shown significant improvement in student performance, as measured by the state education agency's Academic Excellence Indicator System.



As of Monday, Graves counted almost 4,000 articles of food in the pantry. Any food donated to the pantry must be USDA approved and in their original package. They will not accept home canned food, fresh produce or perishable foods. They will accept foods packaged by the Food Bank in Lubbock. They appreciate a variety of foods from cake mixes to peanut butter.

Graves said that they supplied 75 families with meals on Thanksgiving. The meals were boxed turkey dinners won by customers of Lowe's who donated the food to the pantry. Some of the meals were put together by the pantry. "We hope to do the same for Christmas with a few extra goodies," Graves said.

Cash donations are appreciated and can be sent to The Food Pantry, PO Box 175, Muleshoe, TX 79347. Linda Tarter will also accept cash donations and can be reached at 272-3119.

Food donations can be dropped off at the Food Pantry between 2-5 p.m. on Tuesday or contributors can call 272-3699 until 5 p.m.

Graves said that the Pantry will be there until "the need is not there anymore."

Mexico stop by the other night asking if we minded that he brought his wife, who has polio, back to see the display. He was from Petersburg.'

For the past ten years, Holmes has added Christmas figures to his yard.

"My wife and I used to live near the Three Way school. We started out by just putting out lights. The first thing I made was the ferris wheel. On nights there were basketball games, bus loads of kids would come to see all the lights we'd add every year."

He and his sons made several of the wooden figures. He has elves, Santas, snowmen and angels. His most recent piece is a 30-foot tall cross. "That was the hardest to make," he said. It took him a week, working all day to drill holes for the 500 lights that edge the cross and to

get it set up in his front yard.

His wife, Venus, is a teacher at Three Way and he has been the director of transportation and maintenance since 1988.

It takes him about a month to set up everything and he takes it down after the first of the year. He recently won \$100 in a decorating contest in Morton. He jokes that it helps him pay the electric bill.

Holmes buys his decorations at flea markets and makes things from what people throw away. His light house is made out of a metal pipe and old police car light, and to make it turn, he has used a rotisserie off of a grill.

He said that he has to fix something everyday on his display whether it is a bulb out on the manger or the Santa fell over. He considers Christmas his only hobby.



# MHS edges No. 5 Slaton

For the second time in eight days, Muleshoe played a near flawless first half and held a double-digit lead against a ranked opponent.

But this time, Muleshoe finished what it started and knocked off No. 5 Slaton 38-35 Tuesday in a non-district game at WJHS gym.

"That's what we needed was a win," Muleshoe coach Jim Gruhlkey said after the Lady Mules halted a four-game losing streak. "We took some ill-advised shots and made some questionable passes at the end. But to our credit we bucked up on defense and held them."

Muleshoe got balanced scoring led by Erin Wilhite's 10 points and a huge defensive effort in the first half.

Dimmitt rallied from a 10point halftime deficit last Tuesday and beat MHS 57-42.

The Lady Mules (4-10) held Slaton to just two field goals in the first half and led 17-6.

"We were patient on offense and were able to control the tempo," Gruhlkey said. Slaton took just 12 shots in the first 16 minutes.

But the Tigerettes started pushing the tempo in the third

quarter.

A 14-6 run that included 3pointers by Cami Caldwell and Allyson Lewis cut the Lady Mules' lead to 22-20 with two minutes left in the third quar-

Muleshoe is starting to develop a killer instinct. Dustin Cleavinger scored 27 points and Muleshoe put away Slaton in the second half of a 68-50 victory Tuesday at WJHS gym.

The Mules (7-4) outscored Slaton 31-19 in the final two quarters of the fast-paced contest.

"We're starting to learn how to finish teams off," Muleshoe coach Ralph Mason said. "The third quarter has been one of our strongest quarters this season, which hasn't always been the

Muleshoe put the defensive clamps on Michael Mosako in the third quarter while stretching its six-point halftime lead to 49-37. The Mules held the 6-7 senior post scoreless after he pumped in 15 first-half points.

Mosako finished with 22 points.




