Farmer's Tax Guide Now Available Here

The popular Farmer's Tax Guide, informational booklet on farm and ranch income tax matters, is now available at the County Extension office first floor of County Court House, according to County Agent Ralph Thomas. Printing, points out Thomas, has been delayed due to changes made in the tax laws by Congress.

Thomas calls attention to several important changes which have been made in the tax code. An additional 20 percent first-year depreciation write-off is now allowed on new machinery and equipment with a limit of \$10,000 set for such purchases on an individual return or \$20,000 in the case of a joint return.

Casualty losses on unimproved business property are now deductible as ordinary income losses, says Thomas. In the past if a farmer lost a barn by fire or storm, the deduction for any uninsured loss was offset first by capital gains. The loss is now reportable on Schedule F the same as depreciation and other business expenses.

Too, the law now permits a farmer to carry back on "operating losses" for three years instead of two. Thomas points out that this permits a loss in 1958 operations to offset 1955 income on which tax was paid.

Thomas urges all agriculturists to keep their "business fences" in top shape, and consult a representative of the Internal Revenue Service or a competent tax accountant on important tax questions. Thomas says that interested persons may either stop by his office and pick up a copy of the Tax Guide or drop him a card and he will mail the publication.

Queen Readies For Christening With Ike In June

SANDRINGHAM, England (UPI)—Queen Elizabeth has been spending her New Year's holidays at her country home in a flurry of preparations for her joint christening with President Eisenhower of the new St. Lawrence Seaway next June.

Officials almost daily visit the Queen's white and gold drawing-room at her vacation mansion here to iron out the details for the opening ceremonies and her tour of Canada, which may be followed by a brief look at the West Coast of the United States.

The Queen last visited North America during her state visit to the United States in October, 1957. Seaway Debut Highlight

The highlight of this trip will be the debut of the seaway, which has been widened and deepened to allow ocean-going ships to travel right into the Great Lakes shared by Canada and the United States.

As the seaway is a joint U. S. Canadian project, secret diplomatic exchanges are expected between Washington and the Queen's name to decide exactly what shall be done by the Queen and what by President Eisenhower at the christening.

So far, plans call for an official Canadian government banquet in Ottawa, which both will attend. Elizabeth also will give a dinner party aboard her royal yacht, the Britannia, to which the Eisenhowers undoubtedly will be invited.

Fly To Canada

The Queen plans to leave London June 18, flying to Newfoundland with Prince Philip on a BOAC comet jet airliner as she's a "poor sailor" on ships.

After a short visit to Newfoundland, the royal pair will sail up the seaway. The Eisenhowers will make the trip on the new waterway in their own presidential yacht, according to palace sources here.

Following the christening, the Queen will make a coast-to-coast tour of Canada.

She may then "slip across the border" into the United States, palace sources say.

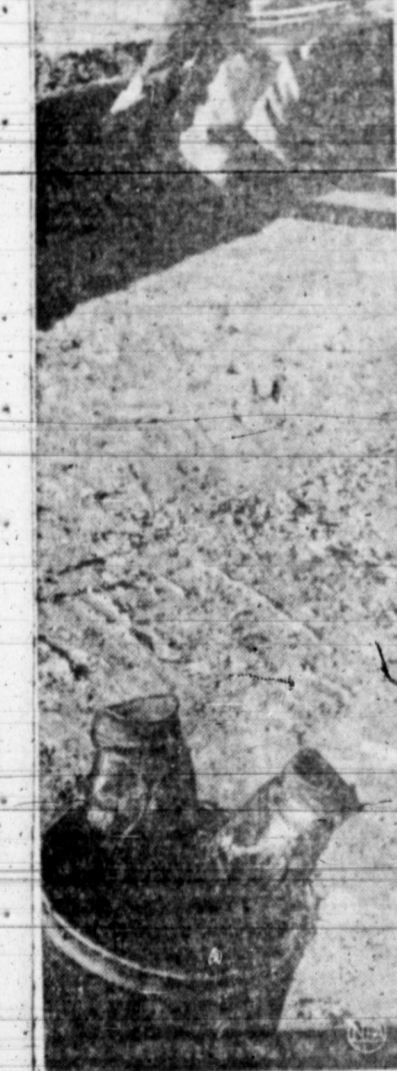

First Aid Facts
FIRST AID IN BURNS
By Dr. Paul F. Meeled*

1. What to do: For first degree burns, coat the area with a soothing, water-washable antiseptic ointment like Unguentine. Cover with sterile gauze and bandage. The ointment will relieve the pain and reduce risk of infection.

Caution: If a first degree burn covers a large part of the body, this can be serious as there is danger of shock. Call your doctor and while waiting, keep the patient lying down and warm.

For second and third degree burns the procedure will be governed by the extent of the burn. A physician should see any third degree burn. The first aid should be the same as in an extensive first degree burn. Small second degree burns may be treated as if they were first degree, but don't open the blisters, as this invites infection. Burns usually cause swelling so carefully remove rings, bracelets, necklaces, belts or shoes from affected area.

2. How to determine the degree of burn: (Frequently there will be different degrees of burns on the same patient.)
First degree — the skin is reddened but intact (appearance of sunburn).
Second degree — blistering of the skin.
Third degree — complete destruction of the skin with involvement of deeper tissues.

Remember: Burns may be deeper than they seem and more extensive than at first apparent. So, if in doubt, play it safe and call your doctor.
