## PRIVATE SCHOOL IS OPENED IN VIRGINIA

CHARLOTTESVILLE, Va. (UPI)—The South's first private school system opens today for white pupils locked out of public schools in the integration battle.

About 240 pupils of Venable Elementary School, shut down by Gov. J. Lindsay Almond Jr. when a federal judge ordered 10 Negroes admitted, were expected to show up for make-shift classes. Assigned to instruct them were 15 regular teachers from Venable. Their quarters were hastily chosen, freshly painted recreation rooms and basements in 15 private homes scattered throughout this university city of 27,000.

## HOUSTON MURDER

### Girl Slays Brother Just For A Thrill

HOUSTON (UPI)—Juvenile authorities today ordered a complete psychiatric examination for a brilliant 16-year-old high school girl who waited in ambush at her home and killed her younger brother "because I didn't want him to suffer."

The boy, Robert D. Humphries Jr., 14, fell dead with a bullet in the head as he walked into the den of their three-bedroom home after school late Tuesday. His books spilled over the floor about his body.

## NAACP May Oppose Board

## Secretary Nixes Bombs For Red China

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Defense Secretary Neil H. McElroy said today he did not think it would be desirable for the United States to approve bombing of the Red Chinese mainland by Nationalist Chinese planes.

McElroy conferred with President Eisenhower on what the White House described as routine Defense Department business.

Earlier, the White House declined comment on a report from Paris that the ambassadors had reached some form of agreement.

Two Democratic senators critical of the administration's Far East policy said in a joint statement Tuesday night that it was "highly unlikely that we can break the Communist blockade of Quemoy without the use of atomic weapons."

Sens. Hubert H. Humphrey (Minn.) and Joseph S. Clark (Pa.) also said they hoped that Ambassador Jacob Beam could negotiate in the Warsaw talks a cease-fire at Quemoy and "the orderly withdrawal of Chinese Nationalist forces."

Humphrey and Clark said in their statement that loss of Quemoy would have no effect on the defense of Formosa and "we have accordingly been dragged to the brink of war again for no purpose remotely connected with our national security."

Moscow Warns Britain  
They said that if the Warsaw talks with Communist China fail, "we should immediately call on the United Nations to bring about a cease fire followed by a military evacuation" of Quemoy.

President Fuad Chehab, acting just 24 hours after he took office, clamped down on the fighting with the shoot-on-sight order. He also sent Lebanese army tanks to the main trouble spot.

The American forces moved in to help maintain security after firing between civilians endangered some American installations.

On the main road north of Beirut, the 3rd Battalion of the 6th Marines moved into the troubled Armenian district with three tanks, three armored amphibious troop carriers and a reinforced platoon of riflemen.

There had been firing between two factions of Armenians—supporters of former President Camille Chamoun and backers of Chehab—along the American military route running through the district.

Throughout the city this morning, feuding Christians and Moslems machine-gunned and burned vehicles on the day preceding the anniversary of the birth of the prophet Mohammed.

Christian Phalangists also chose today to stage another general strike and to hold a mass funeral for one of their number killed in recent violence.

### Naval ROTC Tests Set For Dec. 13

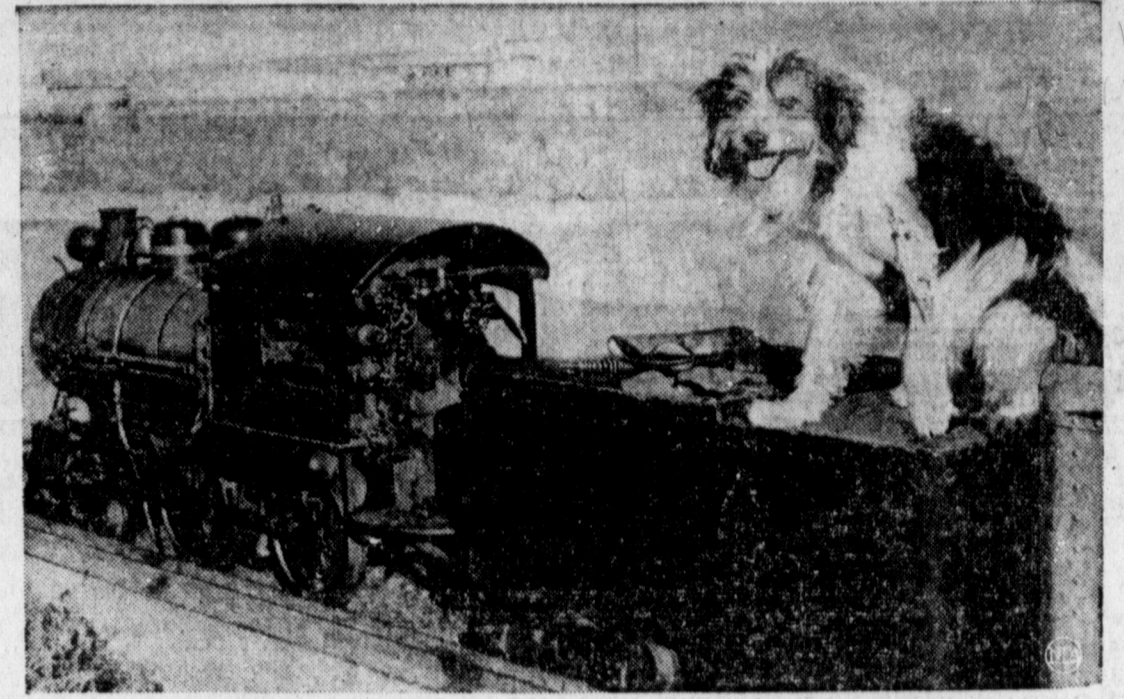
Adm. H. P. Smith, chief of Naval Personnel, has announced that the 13th annual national competitive examinations for the Regular Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps will be given to interested high school seniors and graduates on Dec. 13. Application forms are now available and must be received before Nov. 15, he added.

Designed to supplement the officer output of the Naval Academy, the NROTC program makes it possible for a young man to earn a regular commission while studying at the civilian college of his choice which has an NROTC unit. All tuition, fees and books are furnished by the Navy, and the student receives an annual retainer of \$600 for four years. During the summers the student goes on training cruises as a midshipman. After completing the usual four year college course, he is commissioned in the Regular Navy or Marine Corps and goes on active duty as a prospective career officer with the Navy's far-flung fleets. For those who apply and qualify, immediate assignment to flight training will open new careers in naval aviation.

High school seniors and graduates between the ages of 17 and 21 may apply for the NROTC aptitude test. Those who make a qualifying score will be given a rigid physical exam early in 1959. From the pool of qualified young men remaining in competition, approximately 1800 will be selected to begin their naval careers next September.

The NROTC college training program is also open to enlisted men on active duty with the Navy and Marines. Separate quotas are established for applicants from within these services.

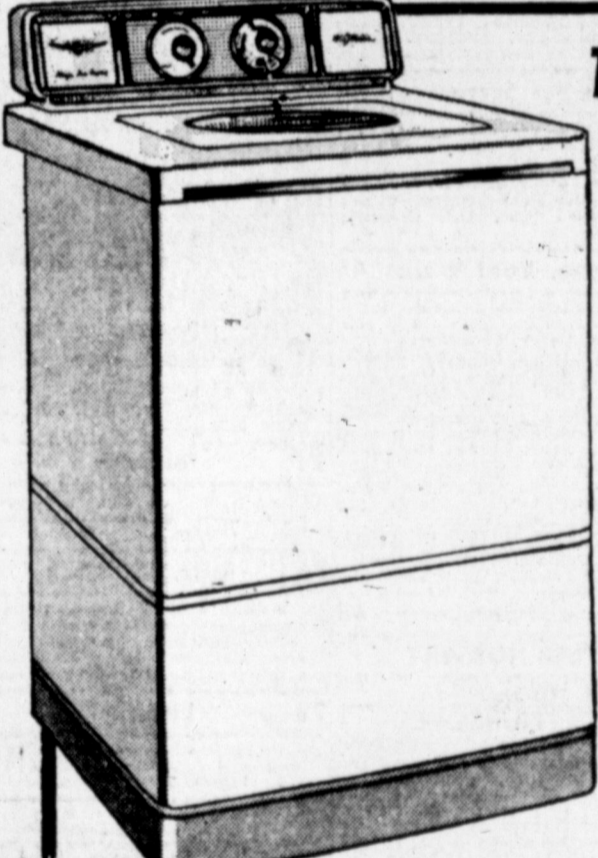

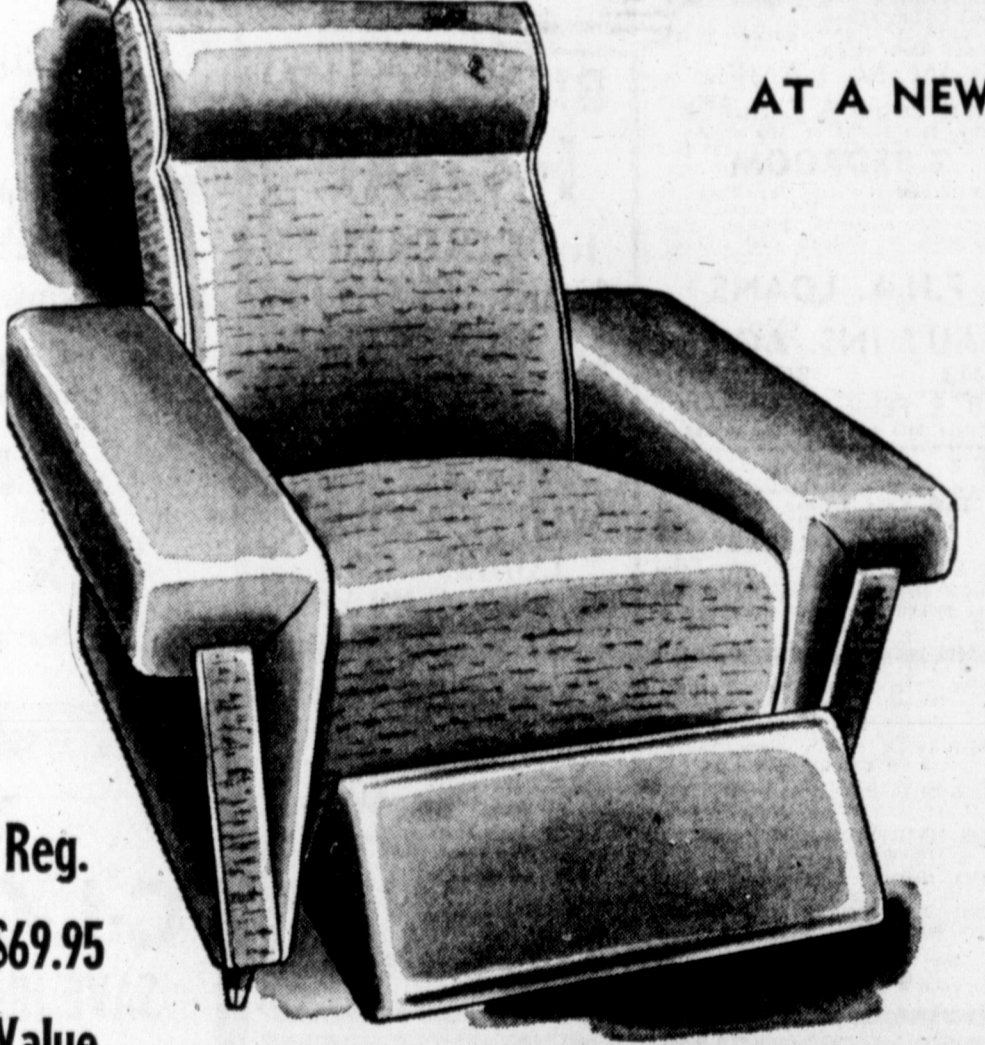

Careful play was required to bring the hand home. East won the opening spade lead and drew trumps with two leads. Three rounds of clubs allowed him to get rid of his losing spade and he ruffed dummy's last spade in his own hand.

This series of plays had eliminated all black cards from his hand and dummy. Now all he had to do was to enter dummy with a third trump lead a diamond and finesse his ten spot. South won with the jack and was now helpless. A diamond lead would be up to East's ace-queen and a spade or club lead would allow East to ruff in dummy and discard his queen of diamonds.
