

### Top O' Texas Has Light Vote Turnout

A light vote was recorded in five Top O' Texas city elections Tuesday, possibly because of cold and wet weather. Following are the area results complete with votes polled:

**MIAMI**—Elected: R. J. Bean, incumbent mayor; Bill Tolbert, 63, and Ellis Locke, 62, aldermen. Defeated: Royce Bailey, 35; Gail Jackson, 38; and William H. Stevenson, 42; aldermen; Bean was unopposed. A total of 123 votes was cast.

**CANADIAN**—Elected: Bill Bartlett, 337, mayor; Jim Fitzgerald, 297, Bob Ward, 296, aldermen. Defeated: Moulou Abraham, 288, mayor; Jess Lindley, 196, Charles Callaway, 285; and Odis Cline, 109, aldermen. Canadian readopted the aldermanic form of government, that went out in 1923. The vote of 294-195 put an end to the commission form of government.

**PANHANDLE**—Elected: Harold P. Smith, 174, C. H. Bell, 180, and Richard Orr, 177, incumbent commissioners. Three aldermen were elected by two-to-one votes. But voters killed a proposal to close part of a parkway by 85-114.

**SHAMROCK**—Elected: Guy Hardin, 212; E. C. Hofmann, 163, commissioners. Defeated: Roy P. Scriber, 161. The candidates ran on a platform of "economic stability" for Shamrock. Hofmann was re-elected to the City Commission. A total of 363 votes was cast.

**GROOM**—Elected: J. C. Ludwig, 29, incumbent mayor; Sanford Johnson, 28, and Ralph Evans, 27, incumbent councilmen. Preston Hardin polled two written votes for the City Council.

### Vose Cone Recovered For 1st Time

**CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (UPI)**—A two-stage test rocketed its experimental nose cone 900 miles down the Atlantic tracking range early today and to the hands of a waiting recovery team. It was the first recovery of a nose cone fired at intercontinental range. In a Defense Department statement released here by the Air Force, officials said the futuristic nose cone was retrieved from the south Atlantic near Ascension Island and little more than two hours after the Thor-Able rocket blasted off from Cape Canaveral. The statement said that although recovery of the cone was a secondary test objective, it was an "additional bonus to the test program as it will provide physical verification of telemetry data received."

The Thor-Able rocket bearing the slim, experimental nose cone was fired at 1:35 a. m. e. s. t. The Pentagon said airplanes and recovery ships saw the cone plunging back toward earth soon afterward.

"At 3:35 a. m. e. s. t., one aircraft sighted the dye marker released from the nose cone recovery package and vectored (guided) the ships to that point," the statement said. "The nose cone was then picked up by an ocean range vessel."

It was the first Thor-Able cone that has been found in seven firings of that rocket on nose cone experiments. Ascension Island is halfway between the coasts of Africa and Brazil, more than 5,000 miles from the cape.

Officials said that "as on previous flights to ICBM range, the nose cone was highly instrumented and provided data throughout its flight and re-entry" into the earth's dense atmosphere.

Upon re-entry, the statement said, "a parachute was ejected to slow the nose cone down. When it impacted, a flotation bag was ejected and automatically inflated. The nose cone was suspended 30 feet in the water below the flotation bag."

### Two Junior High Choirs Going To Canyon Thursday

Junior high school choirs from Region XI will troupe to Canyon Thursday for the annual Inter-scholastic League contests held at West Texas State College. This year Pampa will be represented by two choirs, one consisting of the break-up of the old Pampa Junior High Choir, when Lee Junior High opened in the fall. Mrs. James Webb, Lee choral director, will take her 65 singers into the concert and sight reading competitions. Mrs. Louise Richardson will take her 25 girl Pampa Junior High Choir. A trio will also go from Robert E. Lee. The members are Wilna Carille, Ardis Bernard and Carolyn Jones with Carol Wilson, accompanist.

Last year, under Richard Schiller, the Junior High School took a First Division rating. Over half the choir is now at Robert E. Lee.

## Holmes, Parsley In '3' Run-off

Ed Myatt, fresh from a two-year stint as Commissioner of Ward One, was elected mayor of Pampa by an almost 7-to-1 margin over realtor John Saunders in Tuesday's city election.

A steady all-day drizzle that turned to a driving rain by early evening kept voters away from the polls in droves and resulted in an unimpressive 1,295 votes cast compared to 1,315 Saturday for the school board election.

The important balloting on the formation of a commission to draft a new city charter passed handsomely, 1,050 to 262, and all 15 candidates for seats on the Charter Commission won easily.

Elected to seats on the City Commission were H. V. Wilks in Ward One, Jack Vaughn in Ward Two, and James Crawford Jr. in

Ward Four.

Leon Holmes was the largest vote-getter in Ward Three but failed to gain a simple majority over incumbent R. K. Parsley and H. C. Hall. A runoff election will be held.

The most hotly-contested race developed in Ward One where H. V. Wilks outlasted Paul Crossman to win a convincing 320 to 229 victory. John Truby, earnestly campaigning, managed only 60 votes but was against stiff competition.

In Ward Two Jack Vaughn swamped Mitchell Hill, 310 to 95, the largest margin of victory in any of the city's four wards.

Leon Holmes, a political freshman, outpolled R. K. Parsley and H. C. Hall in Ward Three but failed to gain a majority. Thus Holmes and Parsley will meet again in a runoff election in about one month.

Holmes gathered in 55 votes to Parsley's 37 and Hall's 19.

In Ward Four James Crawford Jr., the city's youngest commissioner candidate at 30, overran Glen Radcliff 197 to 70.

Ward One voters, numerically the strongest, cast 610 ballots of the 1,295 total. In Ward Two 396 persons voted, while in Ward Three 311 voted and in Ward Four 178 voted. It was estimated that 3,500 were eligible to vote and hopes were high for a total vote of 1,800 to 2,000.

In 1957 there were 1,553 votes cast, which was near the record high.

Support for Myatt came largely from Wards One and Two, but in every ward the eventual outcome was never in doubt. Myatt captured 532 votes to Saunders' 50 in Ward One, and won 308 to Saunders' 76 in Ward Two. The margins in Wards Three and Four were 76 to 40, and 137 to 63.

Myatt's victory total was 1,096 to 174.

The 15 men elected to the Charter Commission were Bob Olson, Lynn Boyd, Arthur M. Teed, James A. Poole, Crawford Atkinson, T. C. Lively, Gene Fatheree. (See RUN-OFF, Page 3)

## Oklahoma Is Legally Wet

Oklahoma voters approved repeal of a 51-year-old prohibition law to highlight a scattering of state elections Tuesday.

In Chicago, Democratic Mayor Richard J. Daley won re-election by polling more than 70 per cent of the total vote, but two Republican aldermen withstood the tide to win seats on the City Council.

A non-partisan Wisconsin election for a 10-year seat on the state Supreme Court was won by incumbent E. Harold Hallows, who defeated former Republican Atty. Gen. Stewart Honeck.

The Oklahoma vote, which left Mississippi the only remaining "dry" state in the union, was close until the big city vote came pouring in to swing the margin in favor of repeal. Oklahoma and Tulsa counties favored repeal by a margin of two to one and 3 to 1, respectively.

Daley, head of one of the nation's most powerful political machines, defeated former GOP Congressman Timothy Sheehan by the second highest vote percentage in modern history.

Slightly more than one million voters turned out, one of the lowest percentage turnouts since 1931. Sheehan, who campaigned hard in what he expected to be a losing cause, conceded defeat early Tuesday night.

Hallows, a political novice, won a big margin in Milwaukee County to defeat Honeck, who was making his third try at a statewide office after losing in his bid for re-election as Wisconsin attorney general last fall.

After the wet victory became apparent, Safely Commissioner Joe Cannon declined to comment on how hard he would enforce prohibition during that time.

Citizens in Oklahoma City and Tulsa took the news rather quietly. Oklahoma City police said it was even duller than usual just after the wet victory became apparent.

## Adenauer Quits Post In Germany

**BONN, Germany (UPI)**—Chancellor Konrad Adenauer began a month's vacation today, leaving his capitol confused as to his motives for deciding to leave office and guessing as to his successor.

The 53-year-old chancellor, in a move that surprised Germany and the world, announced Tuesday he was leaving office to accept the Christian Democratic Union's nomination for Federal president.

He is expected to remain in office as a lame duck leader until he takes over the largely symbolic job of president on Sept. 12. His election was assured because of his strength in the Federal Assembly which meets in West Berlin July 1.

Western reaction was swift. Washington and London believed his stepping down would enable the Allies to take a more flexible attitude in the forthcoming East-West talks on Berlin and Germany.

Peasants Moscow French President Charles de Gaulle was so surprised and dismayed he called a special cabinet meeting today although he is suffering from the flu. There was some fear the Western position may be weakened.

Moscow did not react officially but the feeling there was sure to be one of joy. The Soviet has regarded Adenauer as its No. 1 Public Enemy and government of Adenauer has called the Russians a man with a cross in one hand and an atomic bomb in the other.

There still was no certainty as to who would succeed Adenauer. Until recently Economics Minister Ludwig Erhard, 62, the man who performed an economic miracle by restoring war-torn Germany to prosperity, was considered the most likely choice.

But he has argued recently with Adenauer. This brought up the

## Light Snow, Heavy Rain Fall In Area

A rare April snowstorm hit the Texas Panhandle today and what may have been a tornado dipped into the northeastern edge of Houston.

E. J. Glass, president of Great State Fabricators Co., at Houston, said a black cloud "seemed to come right down to the ground."

It knocked down at least three utility poles and scattered sizzling electric wires across a street. Heavy rains fell in Houston.

An inch of snow covered the ground at Dafford and Perryton in the northern Panhandle. A lighter snowfall covered the green grass at Amarillo.

"But more important to farmers and ranchers were heavy rains. Muleshoe reported two inches. The 1.11 inches that Amarillo had was the first rain of any consequence in eight months.

Showers May Spread Furthermore, there were reports of rain from many other points and Texas stood to get more rain today and tonight. The reason for it was a low pressure system centered over the Lower Rio Grande.

It was expected to drift slowly southeastward, bringing showers and thunderstorms especially to the South and East Texas. The chances were good in those areas for general rains. M. C. Harrison, chief meteorologist of the Dallas Weather Bureau, said:

North Central Texas also may get additional rain. Rainfall in that section of Texas is about half of normal for the year and there were reports of only light amounts through the night.

The best chances for rain are along the coast," Harrison said. "The chances for additional moisture are decreasing over the northwest portion of the state."

**Funnel Cloud Reported** A cold front that pushed across the state also brought unseasonable temperatures. The overnight low at Amarillo was 32 degrees and it was expected to get into the lower 40s tonight in the Dallas-Fort Worth area.

Tornadoes were predicted in West Texas Tuesday. The only report of a funnel cloud was at Denver City in the South Plains near the New Mexico line. It was under a tornado alert for 25 minutes.

Snow started falling in Amarillo at 1:45 a. m. after a steel storm. Because of the temperature the snow at Amarillo quickly turned to slush.

Perryton recorded 1.25 inches of moisture, including rain that fell along with the snow. Childress had 1.85 inch. Clarendon 98 inch and Dabhart .07. Muleshoe's rain fell in two hours.

## Rebels In Tibet Offer Resistance

**NEW DELHI (UPI)**—The Chinese Communists have rushed troops, guns and automatic weapons into the rebellious areas of Tibet but fierce Khampa tribesmen are "giving them hell" in wild guerrilla fighting, it was reported here today.

Reliable sources in New Delhi said the Chinese also had brought in hand-picked generals and a contingent of troops from Inner Mongolia accustomed to terrain almost as difficult as that of Tibet. But disruption of Tibet's few roads by the Khampas has hampered their activities.

The reports said the Chinese strategy of wiping out pockets of resistance failed when the tribesmen blew up at least seven bridges on the only road from China to the Tibetan capital of Lhasa.

One group of Khampas killed 100 Chinese in an ambush, it was said.

Reliable reports said the rebellion against Peiping was growing daily and that an increasingly large number of Tibetans were helping the Khampa tribesmen, secretly if not openly.

The reports said it appeared unlikely the Chinese could wipe out the pockets of resistance because of the Khampas' knowledge of the mountainous terrain and their skill at mountaineering acquired during the years as nomadic herdsmen.

Peiping Radio, which has stepped up its broadcasts to India since Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru granted diplomatic asylum to the Dalai Lama, said today the god-king of Tibet was in such poor health when last seen in Lhasa it was "feared that he might die."

Indian reports said the Dalai Lama was in good health though tired when he reached India. He was reported today traveling overland through the Assam jungles under heavy Indian army guard toward an airport. He is expected to fly to New Delhi within a week.

## MAY BRING TROUBLE!

## Soviet Shipment Is Slap At U A R

**BEIRUT, Lebanon (UPI)**—The open Soviet shipment of 855 well-armed Kurdish tribesmen through the Suez Canal to Iraq may be the forerunner of explosive new troubles for the tense Middle East, it was feared here today.

The move also constituted a direct public slap at United Arab Republic President Gamal Abdel Nasser and brought concern from Iranian and political circles in Tehran about a possible new Kurdish thrust to Iran.

Informed sources in Beirut speculated that arrival of the Kurdish tribesmen could be the forerunner of any one of four things:

A joint Soviet-Iraqi backed move for an independent Kurdistan—a move which would play havoc with Turkey, Iran and Syria. All three countries have large Kurdish minorities.

Soviet-trained Kurd tribesmen could be going into Iraq to furnish new cadres of trained party members for the Iraqi Reds.

The Kurds could be aimed at stirring up trouble with Iran's Kurdish minority with perhaps the long-term goal of overthrowing the Shah of Iran. Iran quashed such an attempt several years ago.

They could be trained off workers destined for the northern Iraqi city of Kirkuk and a role in any contemplated Iraqi nationalization of the Iraq Petroleum Company.

Port Said reports said the Kurds were Russian in origin but most reports here believed they were the Kurds who have been uprooted in northern Iran.

Their leader, Mustapha Barzani, who held the rank of major general in the Soviet army and was leader of the revolt in Iran, returned to Iraq after last July's coup and has been friendly with Iraqi Premier Abdel Karim Kassem.

There are 4,500,000 Kurds in Turkey, 300,000 in Syria, 2,500,000 in Iran, and 1,500,000 in Iraq. They were promised self-determination in the 1920 Treaty of Sevres which ended the war between the Allied powers and Turkey but the latter Treaty of Lausanne which carved up the Middle East left them out in the cold.

## Guard Shot In Vatican

**VATICAN CITY (UPI)**—A former member of the Swiss Guard, shot and wounded the commander of the unit today and then tried to kill himself.

High Vatican sources said the shooting was done with a pistol smuggled through Vatican sentries into the heart of the city-state where Pope John XXIII lives and works.

The sources said Col Robert Nuenlist, 48, the commander, was wounded at least twice in the neck and body. The sources said he would recover in about two weeks.

The source identified the assailant as Adolph Ruckers, 34, who wounded himself in the nose and forehead after shooting Nuenlist.

He said he would be hospitalized for about a week.

The sources said Ruckers, who came from Argau, had been dismissed from the guard some time ago for reasons of health. They said he had said repeated visits to Nuenlist since then in an attempt to be reinstated.

Somewhere in his clothing he had concealed a pistol. In the commander's office, after some heated words, the former guardsman pulled out the pistol and opened fire.

Both Ruckers and Nuenlist were rushed from the vatican to a nearby hospital. Ruckers suffered from shock in addition to his wounds, the sources said.

The shooting was the first known case of bloodshed in the 108.7-acre Vatican state in recent years.


