

What Is The Aim Of "The Fund For The Republic"?

I received a bulletin from The Fund for the Republic and a letter accompanying it signed by Elmo Roper inviting me to join the Board of Directors of The Fund for the Republic for cocktails and a dinner Dec. 5 at their new Center for the Study of Democratic Institutions at Santa Barbara, California.

After I had read the folder and the letter. I really didn't know much about what they were trying to do when they talk about the Study of Democratic Institutions. "Study" is a popular method of leading people to believe that they are students and trying to understand natural law. They have spent \$100,000 for a

new Center at Santa Barbara. The letter is loosely written, chameteon words. They never define their terms nor reduce what they are talking about

I am sure I do not know what they mean by "Democratic Institutions", and looking at their Board of Directors and some of the things they have written and said, I doubt whether they know.

They use such words as "reasonable conversation according to reasonable rules", but they never define "reasonable"

They talk about "an intellectual and scientific center" as if intelligence was located in certain geographical places. They seem to have joined with

the University of California, which has a branch at Santa Barbara, and hope to make Santa' Barbara an intellectual center. But the college at Santa Barbara is based on a democracy of the majority. Whatever the majority regards as education becomes education. There are no principles, no axioms, no maxims. The majority can disobey natural law and they seem to think no one

needs to suffer the consequences. They write: "The purpose of the Center...is to clarify the issues of the free society so that a reasonable debate can take place, and then to promote the debate." They love the word

"reasonable" Why not try the Decalogue? Then they write: "The nature and scope of the present world crisis justifies scholarly thought and sustained discussion about how to deal with it. In the United States, and in many other parts of the Western world, almost all the goals of the nineteenth century reformers have been achieved. The United States has education, information, wealth,

I do not, of course, know what they mean by "the goals of the nineteenth century" being achieved, unless they mean that we have had more government, more welfare statism, more socialism and more communism.

leisure, and democracy."

I also wonder what they mean by the word "education". If we really had education in the United States, would we be in the sorry mess we are in today? Would crime be increasing? Would people be so irresponsible? Would we have one law after another that violates the Decalogue and the Declaration of Independence? Would we have almost continuous wars? Would we be subsidizing farmers and colfeges and making the man who does not want to attend college help pay for it? Certainly if we

really had education we would not be doing any of these things. In the same paragraph, after they said "The United States has education", they say: "Everywhere leaders get more scared, more disposed to mere expedients. Everywhere the led get more sceptical. Everywhere - fast or slowly-everyone gets materially better off. Everywhere everyone feels more emptiness at the core of societies, their politics, and their varying outlooks on life.


