Learn Skin Type To Capitalize On Cosmetics

What kind of skin have you? Is it dry, oily, normal or a combination of dry and oily? Chances are, you don't know. Most women go through life without really understanding their skin type.

This can be disastrous because, unless you know your skin type, you can treat your skin problems to exactly the wrong care. The results? Blackheads, pimples, enlarged pores and premature wrinkles. For skin disorders are easily got and difficult to lose.

Creaming an oily skin is like treating a burn with fire. And since it's the oily skin that has the most problems, it's important to know how to identify it and how to handle it. An oily skin is common in teenagers as well as adults. It tends to be coarse in texture, has clogged or

enlarged pores, sprouts pimples and blackheads easily. It is, then, a skin that takes babying.

To keep an oily skin free of clogging oils, a special liquid cleanser is ideal. This cleanser is designed to dissolve secretions that accumulate in the pores. It's used even after a soap-and-water cleansing and should be applied four or five times a day.

There are other general rules for care of oily skin. Never use creams on pimply areas of the face. Avoid cake makeup which can clog and further enlarge

pores. Liquid cosmetics are better for an oily skin. Use a grainy cleansing mask three times a week. Treat blemishes with a flesh-tinted acne lotion.

Tuna Shortcake Long On Flavor

Tuna Shortcake is short on effort but long on flavor. This main dish will be good to the last morsel because it combines such family favorites as canned tuna, mushroom soup, peas and ripe olives.

The tuna topping can be assembled and heated while the biscuits are baking. And the biscuits are a cinch to make with a prepared mix.

TUNA SHORTCAKES

- 2 cups biscuit mix
- 2/3 cup milk
- 1 can mushroom soup
- 2 cans (6 1/2 or 7 ounces) tuna
- 1-3 cup sliced pitted ripe olives
- 1 can (1-pound) peas

Add milk to biscuit mix; stir to make a soft dough. Knead 15 strokes. Roll out on lightly floured board, or pastry cloth, 1/4 - 1/2 inch thick. Cut into 12 biscuits with a 2 - inch round scalloped cutter. Place on ungreased baking sheet. Bake in a hot oven, (450 degree F.) 10 to 15 minutes. While biscuits are baking, combine mushroom soup, tuna, ripe olives and peas with liquid in a saucepan; heat to serving temperature. Place biscuits in a ring on warm platter. If desired, place additional ripe olives on top of each biscuit. Spoon tuna mixture in center. YIELD: 4 servings.

Read this truth, and remind yourself that just as God remembered the children of Israel, and His promises to them, so will he remember and keep His promises to us.

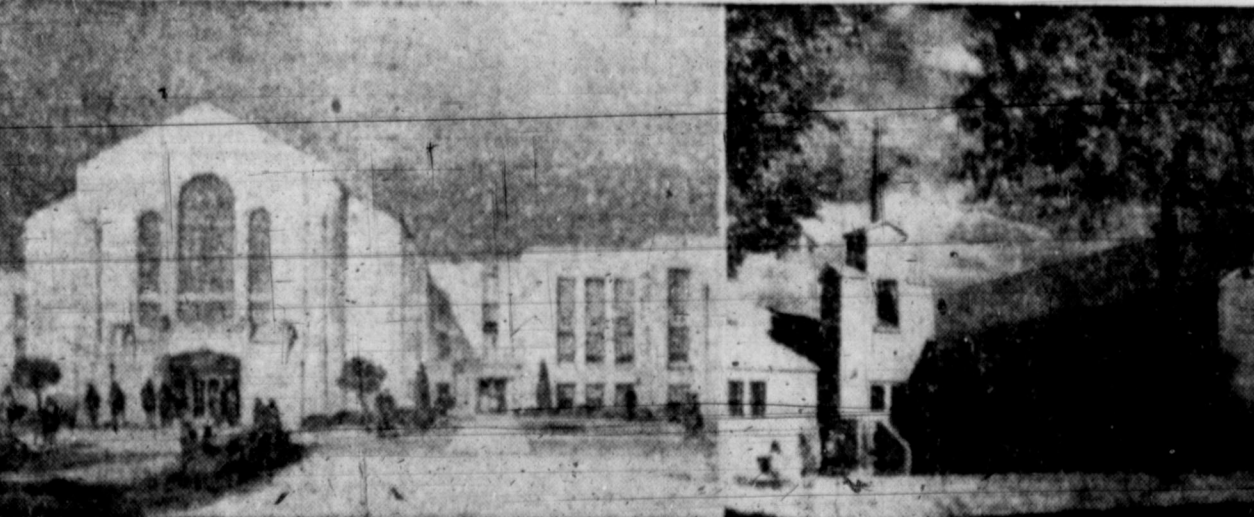
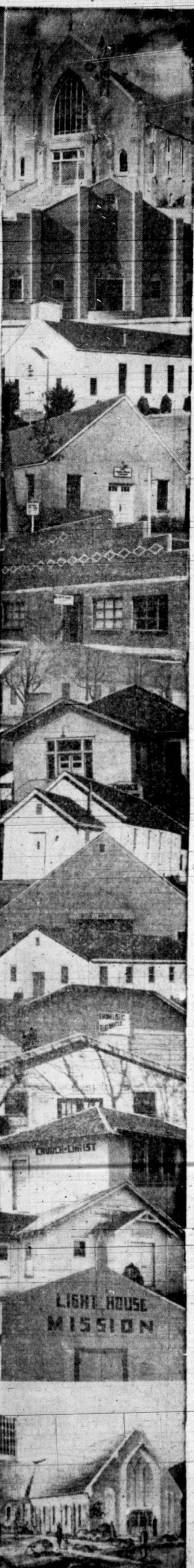
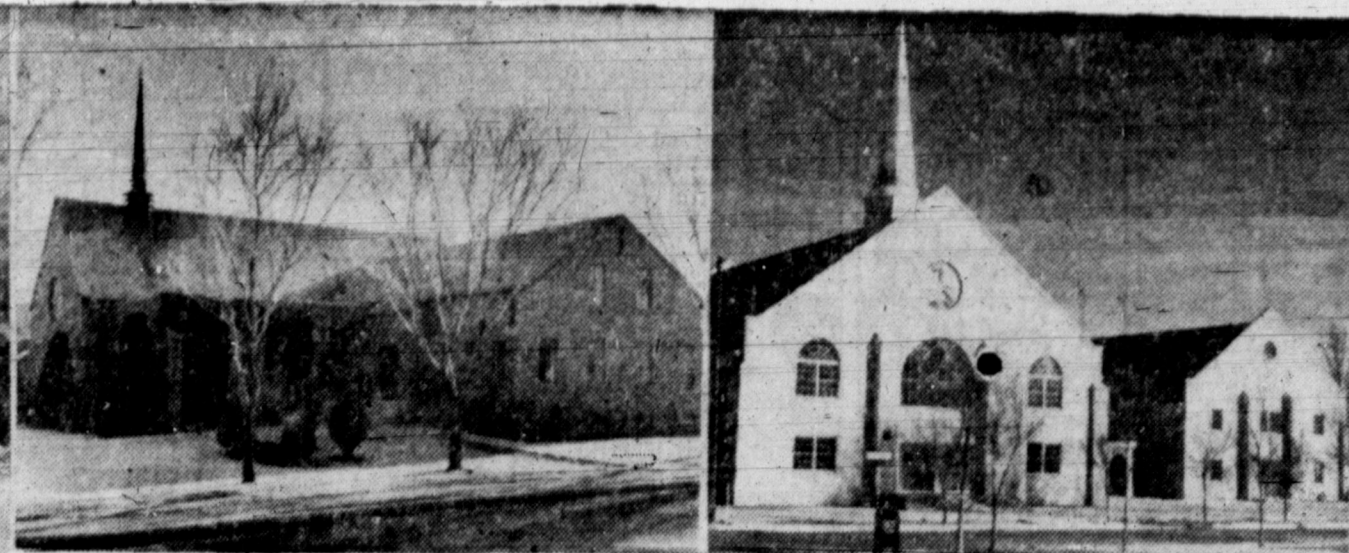
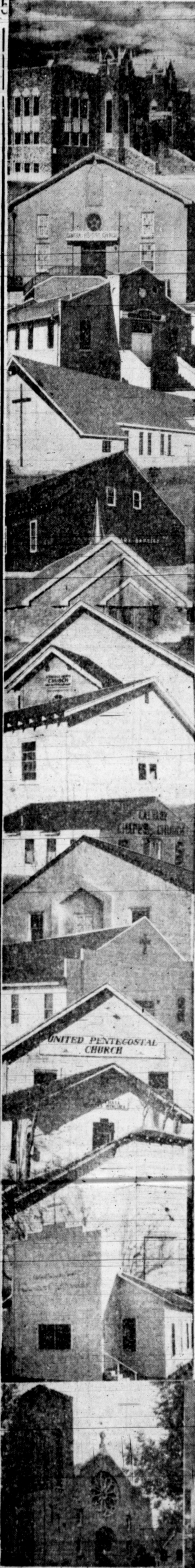

State Of Union

Following is a kind of report on the state of the union which some politicians and wasters of public money would prefer the people didn't see. Great Similarities

Many of our good friends have been shocked at the indication of accord which seems in the making between our vice president, Richard Nixon, and the head of the socialist monolithic state, Nikita Khrushchev.

These friends of ours are disturbed by the spectacle created on TV screens and by means of many other places, and they cannot see how a government such as the American republic can be a government responsible for such murders.

They have had hopes of instituting the concept of freedom and of liberation in the hearts of the oppressed multitudes in various countries behind the iron curtain. They see in this apparent affinity between the heads of these two states a virtual betrayal of the millions of enslaved persons who compose so large a share of the Soviet Union.

Actually, what our friends are guilty of by this reasoning is to blame the government of Russia. They have imagined that the American form of government is so superior in itself, that it precludes tyranny. And at this demonstration of good fellowship between Russian and American top flight politicians, they recoil in horror.

Exploration of the Arctic region has spread over more than 2,000 years. The first-known Arctic explorer was Pytheas, a Greek, who seems to have traveled as far north as the Arctic circle about 325 B.C.

But there is certainly a large area of agreement between these two major powers. And what we ought to recognize is that no form of government in itself is sufficient to prevent the onward march of socialism, whether it is on a global pattern or on a national pattern.

"The Things We Know That Are Not So That Religion Is Not Economics"

I was very much interested in a pamphlet issued by the American Economic Foundation and written by Fred G. Clark and Richard Stanton Rimanoczy on the above subject.

This column has repeatedly contended that all political and economic questions are of necessity based on the moral laws as set down in the Decalogue. To the degree that people understand these moral laws and practice them they will have desirable political and economic conditions.

Judging from the official attitude of some of our large Protestant church groups which concern themselves with economics and sociology, many of these leaders seem to believe that the economic system of the United States has no necessary connection with Christianity.

They seem to feel that the American people motivated as they are by the directives of the Ten Commandments and the Golden Rule, would be just as happy and more efficient under socialism, receiving their directives from government bureaus.

"Let's do a little simple reasoning and see whether this is true. 'We must start with the fact that Christians recognize themselves as individual creatures of God, born to be free, and therefore naturally endowed with inalienable sovereignty which, among their other natural rights, entitles them to make their own economic arrangements.'

"They recognize that this freedom should be exercised within the framework of a moral code involving self-discipline and Christian charity. 'They recognize that perfect use of this freedom is made difficult by human frailties, but they insist on the right to try.'

"This revolutionary concept of the nature of Man was the key source of inspiration when our Founding Fathers declared: 'It becomes necessary for one people to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them.'

"The next 170 years was a miracle of abundant, unequalled, material progress. 'Because no human institution can be perfect, it cannot be said that the economic freedom of the infant nation was always used wisely and ethically, but it was used so energetically, on such a broad front, that the failures and the petty thievery were swept up in the flood tide of prosperity.

"A new and better economic life, private enterprise, had been created for all the world to see. 'Now let's look at socialism - which is state enterprise. 'Historically, socialism preceded private enterprise and was trying to destroy it. 'Socialism is as old as Caesar and as current as Khrushchev. 'It denies the nature of Man as a creature of God, and considers him a creature of the State, existing for the greater glory of the State.

The Allen-Scott Report

ROBERT S. ALLEN PAUL SCOTT DE GAULLE SAYS FRANCE WILL QUIT UN UNLESS US OPPOSES ALGERIAN INDEPENDENCE

WASHINGTON - President de Gaulle is risking a new drastic demand on the U.S. On top of his recent barring of missiles from France because the U.S. refused to give him control over their nuclear warheads, de Gaulle is now threatening to walk out of the United Nations unless the U.S. actively opposes a declaration favoring independence for Algeria.

The Afro-Asian bloc will propose that at the General Assembly which convenes in September, last year such a resolution failed by one vote, of the necessary two-thirds majority when the U.S. abstained.

Now de Gaulle is demanding the U.S. go further than this. He wants the U.S. to vote against Algerian independence - or France will quit the U.N. This highly disruptive barter threat was the real reason for UN Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold's hurried trip to Paris last week for several long talks with de Gaulle, while his discussions were friendly, Hammarskjold no assurances from the French chief.

In the state department, two moves are underway to ease the strained relations with de Gaulle: A personal meeting between him and President Eisenhower either in Washington or Paris. Department policy planners have drafted a "position paper" advocating the U.S. vote against Algerian independence at the forthcoming session of the General Assembly.

Taking such a stand has yet to be approved by Secretary of State Herter and the President. Herter will consider the "position paper" when he returns from the East-West foreign ministers conference in Geneva. He will then present the matter before the President for his decision.

France's urgent need for U.S. support is clearly indicated by what Assistant Secretary of State William Macomber is telling congressional leaders. According to him, the Afro-Asian resolution for Algerian independence is certain to be approved unless the U.S. actively opposes it.
