LITTLE ROCK, Ark. (UPI) -Two Little Rock high schools began the second week of token integration quietly today with school administrators facing the prospect of setting up segregated facilities inside the schools for Negro stu-

There was no disturbance as the three Negro girls who have integrated Hall Eigh school walked into the front door at 7:50 a.m. White students scarcely gave them a glance.

Jefferson Thomas, the Negro

High School, arrived at 7:55 a.m. About two dozen white students were standing around the front door when he arrived. They anreported inside the schools. School peared to may him no attention.





She found it: safe and nourishing food for delicate fish had to be cooked. Cooking cropped up time

That's when she told her husband to mind the store all by himself, because she was going into executive session with her pans and boiled, roasted or baked that liver, spinach, infusions of Vitamin B-12 and occasional inlays of other fish worked best. Sick tropicals, lying inert in their tanks, began to show a wiggle of life and their eyes brightened up. Carefully, like a woman making a prize Lady Baltimore cake Mrs. Donadio began perfecting cooked formulae. First, one. Ther a second cropped up that did the job and made ill fish well. that she had to start making a charge. She didn't feel that she could afford to feed half the tropical fish in the country. No aquarist protested. Indeed, some offered to underwrite her. But she declined courteously and began packaging her three foods for troubled fish. The price was right and the orders multipled. Finally, to keep her family properly fed, she had to get out of the kitchen with her stews and brews for fish and build a small processing factory. That, too, has grown.

Today her Peekskill tropical fish food is bringing in \$100,000 a year. which is an unbelievable growth in six years from an experimental bunch of stuff thrown into a double boiler as an experiment. Orders come from every state and thus far, she hasn't had one failure.

The rough skin of pellagra is characteristic. Although pellagra can cause death there are propably many more people whose health is damaged but who manage to survive.

As in the case in other disorers caused by insufficient vitamins, the major effort against this disease should be aimed at prevention. A well balanced diet, including fresh vegetables and dairy products is desirable. If such foods are available there should be no reason for anyone to develop pellagra. Because pellagra preventing foods are relatively costly, however, the disease is more common in regions of the world which are economically depressed.
